

Colonel Johnathan B. Frasier Project Manager, Aviation Mission Systems

Colonel Johnathan Frasier was born in Cedartown, Georgia. He received a Regular Army Commission from the United States Military Academy (USMA) at West Point, Class of 1995, and was assigned to the Aviation Branch upon graduation. He holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering from the USMA, a Master of Science Degree in Aerospace Engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology, and a Master of Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College. His military education includes the Aviation Officer Basic Course, the Aviation Officer Advanced Course, Combined Arms and Services Staff School, the Intermediate Level Education and Qualification Course, and the Army War College. He is Level III Certified Acquisition Professional in both Test and Evaluation and Program Management. He is a graduate of both the United States Army Rotary and Fixed Wing Aircraft Qualification Courses and the OH-58D Instructor Pilot/Methods of Instruction Course. Additionally, COL Frasier is a graduate of the United States Naval Test Pilot School, Class 129 and is a Master Army Aviator.

COL Frasier has served in various command and staff positions during his 23 years of active military service. His assignments include: Scout Platoon Leader, First Squadron, Seventh Cavalry Regiment, First Cavalry Division (1CD), Fort Hood, Texas; Division Support Command Personnel Officer (Forward), 1CD, Eagle Base, Bosnia-Herzegovina (Stabilization Forces (SFOR4)); Assistant Brigade Operations Officer/Battle Captain, Aviation Brigade, 1CD, Comanche Base, Bosnia-Herzegovina (SFOR5); Assistant Brigade Operations Officer, Aviation Brigade, 1CD, Fort Hood, Texas; Commander, Charlie Company, First Battalion, Fourteenth Aviation Regiment, Fort Rucker, Alabama. After transitioning to the Army Acquisition Corps in 2003, COL Frasier served as an Experimental Test Pilot and Chief, Systems Integration and Simulation Division while assigned to Aviation Technical Test Center and Aviation Flight Test Directorate at Fort Rucker and Redstone Arsenal, Alabama. In 2011, COL Frasier joined Program Executive Office Aviation and served as the Assistant Product Manager for Air Traffic Control Systems. COL Frasier was then selected to help stand up the Fixed Wing Program Office where he served as the Product Director for Fixed Wing Transport Aircraft. Subsequently, he served as the Product Manager for Army Air Traffic Control.
