LTC Matthew C. Miller was born in Lansing, Michigan in 1971. He graduated from Cranbrook Kingswood High School in 1989 and enlisted in the U.S. Army. He completed Basic Training and AIT (11C) at Fort Benning, GA, then was sent to Germany as part of an infantry cohort with the 3rd Armored Division. After participating in Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm, he completed his enlistment to attend George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia, in order pursue a Bachelor in International Relations/Government Politics, as well as a Master in Conflict Analysis and Resolution. LTC Miller returned to active duty in 2001 as an Infantry Officer, and later transferred to Logistics in 2007.

His professional military education includes the Infantry Officer Basic Course, Combined Logistics Captain's Career Course, Basic and Advanced Military Transition Team Courses, Support Operations Course, AFPAK Hand Advise and Assist Course, language proficiency training for French and Dari, and he attended the US Army Command and General Staff College.

Lieutenant Colonel Miller's previous assignments include duties as the S3 with the Headquarters Command Battalion, Fort Myer, VA; served as an Aide-de-Camp for the NATO Commander in Bosnia-Herzegovina; deployed as the logistics advisor for a Battalion Military Training and Transition (MiTT) team in Mosul, Iraq; completed his Company Command with the 61st Ordnance Brigade at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Maryland; served as an AFPAK Hand logistics advisor in Afghanistan from 2011 through 2015; and served on the Joint Staff as a J5 Europe, NATO, Russia (ENR) Plans Officer.

His recent assignments include the 16th Military Police Brigade in Fort Bragg, NC, as the Brigade S4; and he most recently completed his assignment as the Special Operations Command Africa (SOCAFRICA) J47 Logistics Exercise Planner Branch Chief where his team was responsible for the sustainment planning, coordination and execution of Flintlock, AFRICOM and SOCAFRICA's largest exercise on the continent.
