Major General Thomas A. Pugh

Director, Networks and C4 Services



Major General Thomas (Tom) A. Pugh joined Headquarters, Department of the Army Chief Information Officer (CIO)/Deputy Chief of Staff, G-6 (DCofS, G-6) in June 2020. Following the realignment of the CIO and DCofS, G-6 into separate staffs, he assumed duties as the Director of Networks and Command, Control, Communications and Computer Services (C4), Major General Pugh reports directly to the Army G-6. He is responsible for strategy, policy, and guidance to enable mission command across the Army's Global Enterprise Network.

Major General Thomas Pugh is from Signal Mountain, Tennessee. He graduated from the Virginia Military Institute in 1990 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Signal Corps. Upon completion of the Signal Officer Basic Course at Fort Gordon, Georgia in November 1990, he was assigned to the 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry) at Fort Drum, New York. He first served as the Battalion Signal Officer for 2nd Battalion, 7th Field Artillery Regiment, and then in the 10th Signal Battalion he served as a platoon leader in Bravo Company and then as the Assistant S3.

After graduating the Signal Officer Advanced Course at Fort Gordon in October 1995, he was assigned as the Plans Officer for 7th Signal Brigade in Mannheim, Germany. In June 1997, he took command of Alpha Company, 44th Signal Battalion, 7th Signal Brigade, returning to Fort Gordon in January 1999 to serve as a Small Group Leader for the Signal Captain's Career Course until 2001.

After graduating the Command and General Staff College in 2002, Major General Pugh was assigned as the Operations Officer for the 35th Signal Brigade (Airborne) at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He became the S3 for the 35th Signal Brigade (Airborne) in May 2003. In the summer of 2006, he became the Director of Plans and Operations for the XVIII Airborne Corps G6. He then took command of the 2nd Joint Communications Squadron, Joint Communications Support Element (Airborne) at MacDill Air Force Base, Florida in May 2007, where he served until June 2010. In April 2011 Major General Pugh assumed Command of the 35th Signal Brigade (Theater)(Tactical) at Fort Gordon, Georgia until June 2013. Graduating from the Air War College at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama in May 2014, he became the 37th Chief of Signal and the Commandant of the US Army Signal School at Fort Gordon, Georgia in August 2014. In 2016, Major General Pugh was assigned to Headquarters, United States European Command in Stuttgart, Germany where he served as the Director for Command, Control, Communications and Computers (C4) and the Director for the Joint Cyber Center until 2018, when he assumed command of the 7th Signal Command at Fort Gordon, Georgia.

His awards and decorations are commensurate with his time in service and include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, the Parachutist badge, the Air Assault Badge, and the German Parachutist Badge.
