**c. Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.**

The DPG Unclassified Installation Campus Area Network (DPG U-ICAN) provides unclassified communications to the DPG and garrison and tenant activities. User workstations are primarily used to access email to include Army Knowledge On-Line, Department of Defense Information Network-Army, Enterprise Email, and other unclassified websites. The DPGU-ICAN contains PII that is primarily collected to support user access requests. Other PII, such as personnel evaluations, personnel security clearances, and personnel resource management actions from online databases may be stored on individual user workstations and server shares on the ICAN.

**d. Why is the PII collected and/or what is the intended use of the PII?** (e.g., verification, identification, authentication, data matching, mission-related use, administrative use)

AR 25-2 mandates PII collection to grant system access. AR 690-400 and AR 623-3 mandate PII collection for civilian evaluations and military evaluations, respectively. PII is required to identify individuals and authorize access to information systems.
