orders as they are produced; provide a procedure for amending and revoking orders; provide user maintainable online tables and requests for orders; provide procedures for various order formats and local order printing capability; and provide procedures for maintaining Reserve Personnel, Army (RPA) accounts and an online checkbook that is used to reconcile Standard Financial System (STANFINS) data. AORS produces orders based on time sequences and input requests from functional users and personnel managers. Types of orders produced include training, assignment, appointment, Active Duty Operational Support (ADOS), ADOS-Reserve Component, discharge, attachment, release from attachment, medical, mobilization, temporary duty, Uniform Code of Military Justice, and Sanctuary orders. Fund control for RPA accounts, including miscellaneous obligation documents, is centrally managed within AORS. Checkbooks are reconciled with STANFINS, maintaining a complete history of obligation adjustments and disbursements. PII collected includes personal, contact, medical, employment, education, and military record data. d. Why is the PII collected and/or what is the intended use of the PII? AORS uses PII to verify order requirements and costing information, and to verify rank, Military Occupational Specialty, and other data. AORS uses PII for data matching to select Soldier records from databases, and to identify Soldiers requiring orders and to produce and distribute orders as required by mission requirements. PII is collected for both mission-related and administrative use.
