Mr. John (Mark) Kulick serves as the Logistics Modernization Program (LMP) Business Management Division Chief. In this role, he oversees the LMP Product Management Office's (PMO) operations, contracts, business capabilities acquisition, and resource management teams.

He most recently served as the LMP Resource Management Officer, specifically overseeing the program's budget, facilities, and day-to-day office operations. He re-joined the LMP PMO in November 2016 as the Business Management Division Chief, having previously served on the program from October 2008 to January 2015. During that tenure, he led the Transition of Services (ToS) effort that included planning and implementing the strategic plan to transition work, resources, and responsibilities from the prime contractor to the Government, representing one of the largest transitions in U.S. Army history. He also previously served as the LMP Finance Lead and has experience with other Army organizations managing logistics and working in the LMP system. Mr. Kulick held positions with the Communications-Electronics Command (CECOM) Software Engineering Center (SEC) supporting LMP sustainment, serving as Acting LMP Sustainment Director and Resource Manager for the Armament Research, Development and Engineering Center (ARDEC) Knowledge Management Office Army Shared Services Center (SSC).

Mr. Kulick is a member of the Army Acquisition Corps and is certified Level I in Information Technology, Level I in Business Financial Management, Level II in Program Management, and Level III in Lifecycle Logistics. He independently achieved Project Management Professional (PMP) Certification in December 2017. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from College Misericordia and an Associate's Degree in Electronics Engineering Technology from Luzerne County Community College. He has received the Commanders Award for Civilian Service (2016), Superior Civilian Service Award (2015), Achievement Medal for Civilian Service (2011), and the Achievement Medal for Civilian Service (2010).
