Ms. Miranda Coleman serves as the Product Lead (PL) for the Army Vantage Program under Project Manager (PM), Army Data and Analytics Platforms (ARDAP). She is responsible for managing the life-cycle, including cost, schedule, and performance, of this enterprise data analytics platform that enables Army users at every echelon and across classification levels to view comprehensive Army-wide data, analyze trends, and make data-driven decisions.

She previously served as the Acting PL and Acquisition Branch Lead for the Army Leader Dashboard project (now Army Vantage) where she was responsible for documentation, development, testing, system integration, fielding, sustainment, and product improvements as part of the multi-million dollar production effort.

Ms. Coleman began her Federal service in February 2011 as an Information Technology (IT) Analyst for Program Executive Office (PEO) Soldier. Prior to that, she spent five years with industry working in the knowledge management and IT fields.

Throughout her career, Ms. Coleman has completed numerous acquisition and IT assignments to include: IT Specialist at U.S. Army Rapid Equipping Force (REF); Information Technology lead for PM Soldier Sensors and Lasers (SSL); Acquisition Specialist at the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Acquisition, Logistics and Technology) ASA(ALT) in the Strategic Initiatives Group and Office of the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Plans, Programs and Resources (DASA PP&R); and IT Specialist at PEO Enterprise Information Systems (EIS) within Product Director, Army Human Resource Systems (AHRS) supporting the Product Lead for the Commander's Risk Reduction Dashboard (CRRD) program.
