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A native of Charleston, South Carolina, COL Isaac C. Manigault began his military career as a Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Chemical Corps, Fort McClellan, AL. He currently serves as Deputy The Inspector General (Acting), U.S. Army.

Over his 26-year career, he served in a wide variety of assignments across our Nation in the States of Georgia, North Carolina, Missouri, Washington State, Maryland, Virginia, and Texas. His overseas and operational experience includes Operation Iraqi Freedom; and support to training exercises in Egypt, Kuwait, Bahrain, Japan, and Korea.
