

BRIGADIER GENERAL EDWARD H. 'NED' BAILEY

Commanding General, Regional Health Command – Pacific

Brigadier General Bailey attended the University of Maryland, Baltimore County and the Uniformed Services University. His military education includes the Army Medical Department Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, as well as the Command and General Staff College and the Naval War College.

BG Bailey served in the 82nd Airborne Division from 1984-1987 with 1st Battalion (Airborne), 508th Infantry Regiment and deployed to the Sinai as part of the Multinational Force and Observers.



He commissioned in 1993 and attended the Uniformed Services University, followed by internship and residency in Family Medicine at Womack Army Medical Center, Fort Bragg, N.C. Following training, BG Bailey was assigned to 1st Battalion, 159th Aviation Regiment, and deployed to Bosnia-Herzegovina to serve as the Flight Surgeon for Task Force Med Eagle (SFOR 10). BG Bailey then moved to Fort Drum, N.Y., and deployed to Afghanistan as the Battalion Surgeon for 1st Battalion, 87th Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade, 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry). Upon redeployment, BG Bailey assumed duties as the Chief of Connor Troop Medical Clinic at Fort Drum. His next assignment was as the Brigade Surgeon for the 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry) with a deployment to Iraq. BG Bailey then moved to the 10th Combat Aviation Brigade, where he served as the Chief of the Aviation Medical Clinic and later deployed to Iraq as the Flight Surgeon for Multi National Division-North. BG Bailey then served as the Division Surgeon for the 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry) with a deployment to Afghanistan as the Command Surgeon for Regional Command-South. He then commanded U.S. Army Health Clinic Baumholder, Germany, followed by attendance at the U.S. Navy War College. BG Bailey then commanded the 86th Combat Support Hospital and Task Force Med Eagle in Operation UNITED ASSISTANCE in Liberia. BG Bailey served as the USARCENT Command Surgeon, where he also deployed to Kuwait as the Deputy Chief of Staff (Forward). He then served as Deputy Commander and Commander of the 18th Medical Command (Deployment Support) in Hawaii. His last assignment was Command Surgeon, U.S. Army Forces Command, Fort Bragg, N.C.

BG Bailey's awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit (3 OLC), Bronze Star Medal (2 OLC), Meritorious Service Medal (4 OLC), Army Commendation Medal (2 OLC), Army Achievement Medal (2 OLC), Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal (1 OLC), Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Afghan Campaign Medal (2 service stars), Iraq Campaign Medal (3 service stars), Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (5), NATO Medal (2), Multinational Force and Observers Medal, Army Superior Unit Award (1 OLC), Meritorious Unit Commendation (2 OLC), the Combat Medical Badge, Expert Field Medical Badge, Senior Flight Surgeon Badge, Parachutist Badge, and Air Assault Badge.
