Command Sergeant Major Chantel Y. Sena-Diaz is the Command Sergeant Major of the Mission and Installation Contracting Command at Joint Base San Antonio-Fort Sam Houston, Texas. The MICC, a subordinate command to the U.S. Army Contracting Command, provides Army commands, installations and activities with responsive contracting solutions and oversight. On order, it provides trained and deployable contracting assets to the operating force. The MICC is made up of more than 1,500 Soldiers and Army civilians at two brigades, two field directorate offices, 30 field-level contracting offices and nine battalions located throughout the United States and Puerto Rico.



Prior to assuming responsibility as the MICC Command Sergeant Major, CSM Sena-Diaz served as the Commandant of the Noncommissioned Officer Academy, U.S. Army Soldier Support Institute at Fort Jackson, South Carolina.
