Cynthia (Cyndi) Fisher Chief, Program Support Division Office of the Assistant G-1 for Civilian Personnel Headquarters, Department of the Army Fort Belvoir, Virginia

Ms. Cynthia (Cyndi) Fisher has served as the Chief, Program Support Division, Office of the AG-1CP, since June 2010. As PSD Chief, her responsibilities include: administering the Secretary of the Army Incentive Awards Board; overseeing the programming and execution of the AG-1CP budget; serving as proponent for Civilian Incentive Awards regulation; serving as the Initial Denial Authority for FOIA/PA requests on behalf of the AG-1CP; and providing operational support to AG-1CP staff, to include but not limited to personnel accountability, safety, security, admin management, protocol, space/building management, and information management,

Prior to moving to the AG-1CP, Ms. Fisher served as the G1/G4, Army Human Resources Command. In this position, she was responsible for military and civilian HR, command safety and security (personnel and physical), logistics, space and building management, wellness, family readiness groups and served as the Hoffman Complex Designated Agency Official. During her tenure, Ms. Fisher played a key role in managing the HRC plan for the movement of personnel and missions from three geographic locations (Alexandria, VA; Indianapolis, IN; St. Louis, MO) to Ft. Knox, KY, as a result of BRAC 2005.

Before moving to the Human Resources Command, Ms. Fisher served in various positions within the Hoffman, HQDA, and Ft. Myer Civilian Personnel Advisory Centers (CPACs). Beginning her assignment with the Hoffman Civilian Personnel Office (CPO) as a Personnel Management Specialist, she then progressed into the Career Program 10 intern program. She was a member of the Army team responsible for fielding the Electronic System for Personnel, which was the precursor to the current Modern Defense Civilian Personnel System. She also served as Adjunct Faculty to the Army Center for Civilian Human Resources Management training facility in Lancaster, PA, training Army Civilian Personnel Office employees on electronic processing of personnel actions. Upon graduation from the intern program, Ms. Fisher was instrumental in the transition of the Hoffman CPO into a regional Civilian Personnel Advisory Center (CPAC).
