



Sensory Lending Closet

The Department of the Army (DoA) ACS EFMP is not responsible for any injury, illness or harm resulting from the use of the borrowed items.

The Purpose of the Army Community Service (ACS) Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) Sensory Lending Closet:

ACS EFMP recognizes that caring for a Family Member with special needs can be emotionally and physically challenging, especially while transitioning to and from new duty stations. During the transitional period of the move, the impact of prolonged temporary hotel lodging can lead to increased stress and possible regression for some children. The Sensory Lending Closet is designed to mitigate some of these challenges by loaning sensory items typically used by parents to assist in comforting children with special needs. Families who have a Family Member enrolled in EFMP may borrow the items FREE of charge for a thirty day period in the absence of their household goods.

Required Documents: Valid Military ID, copy of Orders and enrollment in EFMP.

Loan Period: Items are loaned for a thirty day period; however, extended borrowing may sometimes be accommodated, if our inventory permits.

The ACS EFMP Sensory Lending Closet is available to all incoming and outgoing Families who have a Family Member enrolled in EFMP.

- ✓ HBBs Applicants must obtain approval from the USAG-HI, Garrison Commander.
- ✓ HBBs are required to comply with and are subject to inspection by the appropriate city, county, state, or USAG-HI, Federal agency, office or department for compliance with applicable laws, codes, regulations and requirements.
- ✓ HBBs DOES NOT pertain to on-post home childcare. Interest in providing childcare in on-post housing must register, receive training, complete background checks and home inspections, as well as receive certification by the installation Child, Youth, and School (CYS) Services office as part of the Family Child Care (FCC) provider system. Contact CYS Office at (808) 655-1521.
- ✓ Exceptions: If you work remotely from your home or exclusively through online means, you probably don't need approval. Contact the Business and Nonprofit Liaison to review proposed business.
- ✓ Obtain the HBB application and checklist forms by visiting the DFMWR website at <https://hawaii.armymwr.com/programs/usag-hawaii-home-based-businesses-hbbs>

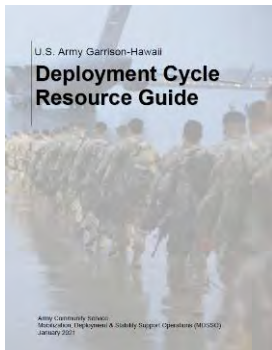

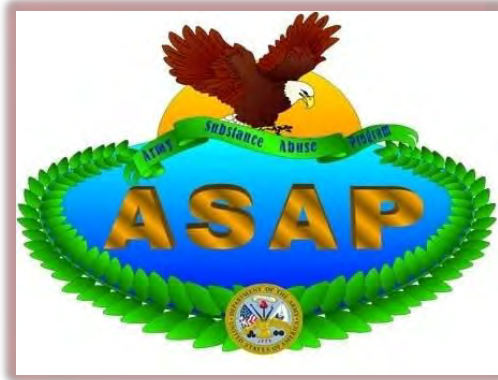

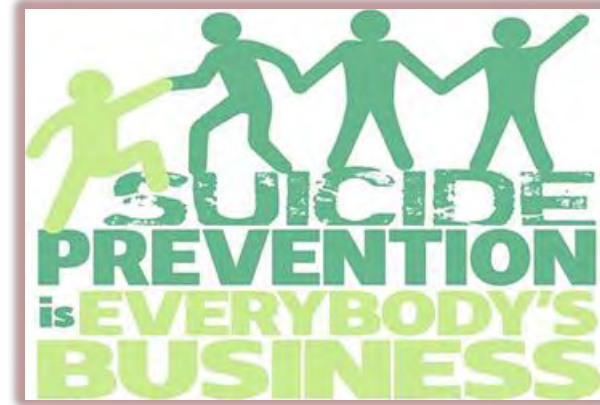

DHR - Total Army Sponsorship Program

- Sponsorship is **required** in order to process permanent change of station (PCS) orders to Hawaii and other regions.

- **Soldiers (E1-O6)**

- ✓ Soldiers must log onto the Army Career Trackers Total Army Sponsorship Program to initiate DA Form 5434 and request a sponsor.
- ✓ Units are required to assign a sponsor 120 days prior to report date.

- **Department of Army Civilians**

- ✓ DA Civilians can fill out the PDF version of the DA Form 5434 and email it to their gaining organization.

- **ACS Sponsorship Classes**

- Classes held every Thursday at 1200 hrs via MS TEAMS.
- Required for all assigned sponsors and volunteers.

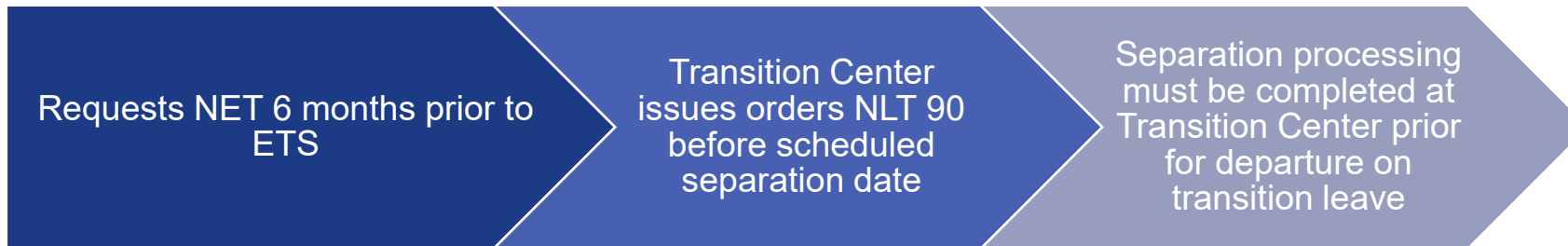

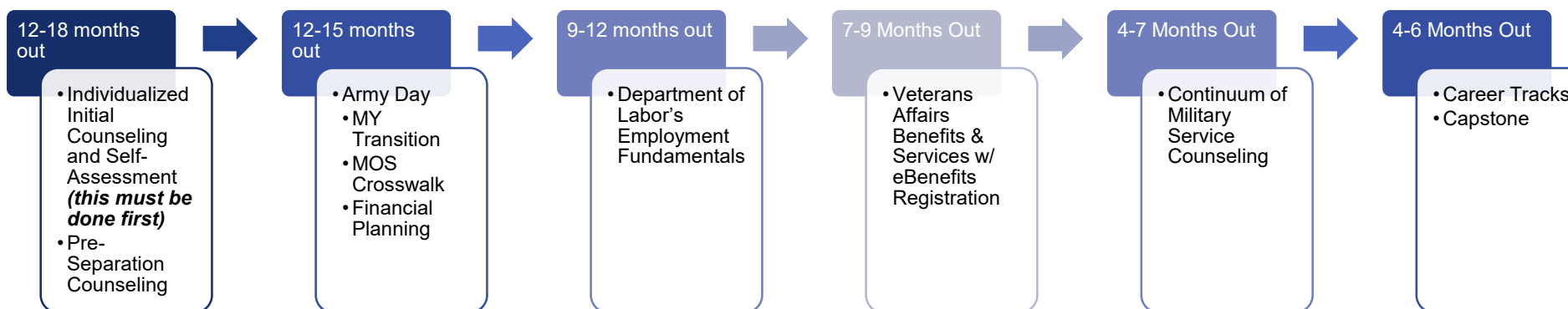


DHR - Transition Assistance Program (TAP)

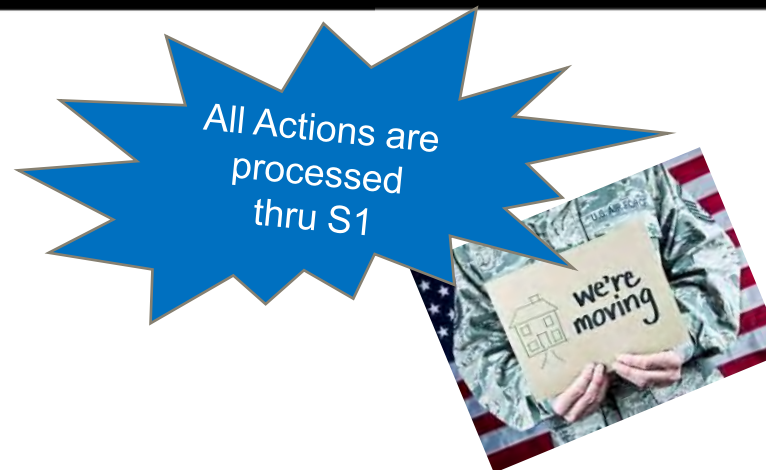

DHR - Reassignment Office

- Process & Publish the Following:
 - ✓ PCS Orders
 - ✓ IPCOT/COT Travel Orders
 - ✓ Excess Leave Orders
 - ✓ Confinement Transfer Orders
 - ✓ Deletion or Deferment of Assignments- Non PSDR units
- Levy Notifications are sent within 5 days of MPD receiving notification of assignment via CAP Cycle. MPD notifies via email to the Soldier, S1, and SGM/CSM. Soldiers are to complete the Levy Packet NLT 30 days from notification.
- Orders are published up to **6 Months** from departure date, if all required documents are submitted to include the PCS ETP. S1 submits completed Levy Packets to:
usarmy.schofield.id-pacific.list.reassignments-hi@mail.mil
- Reassignments Office provides S1's and SGM/CSMs a Missing Documents log weekly.
- It is Army policy that if an individual has a government travel card, it will be used for all relocation expenses up to the limit of their entitlements. A centrally billed account is only available for Soldiers who do not have a government travel card. Account type must be indicated to Reassignments Office prior to orders being cut.

DHR - Family Travel Office

Due to the COVID travel restrictions, the process to request orders for all Government Funded Travel now requires additional steps. (Early Return of Dependent, Dependent Travel, Space A Travel and Student Travel.)

All Government Funded Travel requests are processed as follows:

1. Service Member submits the packet to their Chain of Command (packet checklists provided on the Garrison Webpage)
2. Chain of Command submits the packet to Schofield Family Travel Section Military-Personnel Division (SFTS-MPD)
3. After tentatively approving the request for travel, the SFTS-MPD provides the S-1 a Memorandum to be used as a justification to request a Travel Exception to Policy (ETP) signed by the first General Officer in the Chain of Command.
4. Chain of Command submits the signed ETP to SFTS-MPD
5. SFTS-MPD then provides the final order to S-1 and Service Member

Transportation and Carlson Wagon-lit (SATO) will require a copy of the final orders and signed Travel ETP to book HHG shipments and flights
