

Major General Joseph J. Heck

Deputy Surgeon General for Mobilization, Readiness and Army Reserve Affairs

Major General Joseph J. Heck is a native of New York and moved to Pennsylvania while in high school. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Health Education from the Pennsylvania State University and received his medical degree from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine.

MG Heck completed a general internship at St. Joseph's Hospital and a residency in Emergency Medicine at the Albert Einstein Medical Center, both in Philadelphia. He is board certified in Emergency Medicine with a Certificate of Added Qualification in Emergency Medical Services. MG Heck received his direct commission into the United States Army Reserve Medical Corps and holds a secondary Area of Concentration as a Flight Surgeon and is a graduate of the U.S. Army War College with a Master of Strategic Studies.

He currently serves as the Deputy Surgeon General for Mobilization, Readiness and Army Reserve Affairs.
