Colonel Myron B. McDaniels received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Hampton University (Hampton, Virginia) where he also earned Distinguished Military Graduate honors and commissioned into the Medical Service Corps. He was reassigned to the Medical Corps after earning his Doctor of Medicine degree from Eastern Virginia Medical School (Norfolk, Virginia).

COL McDaniels completed Pediatric internship and residency training at the National Capital Consortium, Bethesda, Maryland and served as a general pediatrician and service or department chief at the 121st General Hospital in Yongsan, Korea; the Medical Activity in Wuerzburg, Germany; and Evans Army Community Hospital at Fort Carson, Colorado. His commands include the 261st Multifunctional Medical Battalion at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and Joint Base Balad, Iraq and the 212th Combat Support Hospital in Miesau, Germany, where the unit completed medical interoperability missions and exercises with NATO and ally countries.
