MG Place's military assignments include Regimental Surgeon for the 75th Ranger Regiment, deploying to OPERATION UPHOLD DEMOCRACY in Haiti; Staff Family Physician, Evans Army Community Hospital, Fort Carson, Colorado; Commander, Medical Task Force 10, Stabilization Force 5, during the Kosovo Air Campaign; Instructor and Director, Medical Operations Branch, Leader Training Center, Army Medical Department Center and School where he became the first physician director of the Army Medical Department Captains Career Courses, Fort Sam Houston, Texas; 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) Division Surgeon, Fort Campbell, Kentucky, deploying to OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM; and Deputy Commander for Clinical Services, Blanchfield Army Community Hospital, Fort Campbell, Kentucky.
