Mrs. Michelle A. Sanner assumed responsibility as the Deputy Commanding General - OCONUS Operations (DCG-OO), U.S. Army Contracting Command, Redstone Arsenal, AL, in October 2023. As the DCG-OO, she is responsible for the training, manning and operations of six Contracting Support Brigades, four Contracting Battalions, and eight Contracting Detachments that are aligned with Army Service Component Commands comprised of more than 1,200 military and civilian personnel who execute over 40,000 contracts worth more than \$2B dollars annually. She provides strategic to tactical contract planning and expertise to support large scale Army and Joint military operations. She also serves as the senior contracting official for all OCONUS Army Contracting Support Brigades.

Prior to assuming responsibilities as the DCG-OO, Mrs. Sanner served as the CONOPS Field Support & Initiatives Division Chief at Headquarters, Army Contracting Command (ACC).



Mrs. Sanner was commissioned in 1991 as a Signal Officer (branch detailed to Air Defense Artillery) upon graduating from Indiana University. Mrs. Sanner's education includes a Bachelor's degree from Indiana University in Sports Science, Master of Science Degree in Procurement and Acquisition Management from Webster University (Jacksonville NAS Campus) and a Master in Strategic Studies from the Air War College. Her military education includes Airborne School, ADA Basic and Patriot Courses, Signal Officer Transition and Advanced Courses, Command and General Staff College, and Senior Service College.

Mrs. Sanner, a retired Army Colonel with 27 years of commissioned service, has held a diverse range of acquisition positions. She served in multiple contracting assignments at the following locations: Grafenwoehr, Germany, Rock Island Arsenal, Illinois, Army Contracting Command - Redstone and ACC Headquarters at Redstone Arsenal, AL. Mrs. Sanner served in key leadership positions including Product Management for the Terminal High Altitude Area Defense (THAAD) Fire Control & Communications and the 408<sup>th</sup> Contracting Support Brigade Commander.
