



CW4 HECTOR X. COLON Senior Legal Administrator Operations Officer/AXO Office of Special Trial Counsel



Chief Warrant Officer Four (CW4) Hector X. Colon enlisted in the US Army in 1987, as a Legal Specialist. In November 1997, he became the first Legal Administrator Warrant Officer for the 65th US Army Regional Support Command, in Puerto Rico, a position he occupied until he retired in August 2007. In November 2008, Chief Colón re-joined the Army Reserves to become the first Legal Administrator for the 75th Battle Command Training Division (BCTD), in Houston, TX. In February 2010, he was assigned as the first Legal Administrator to the G1 and then the G7, USAR Legal Command. From May 2017 through November 2022, he served as the Command Chief Warrant Officer of the USAR Legal Command. In November 2022, he mobilized in his current position as Operations Officer and Assistant Executive Officer (AXO) for the Office of Special Trial Counsel, U.S. Army.

Chief Colon is a graduate of the Warrant Officer Senior Service Education (WOSSE) and has a Master of Science in Management degree from Johns Hopkins University. His awards include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal (with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Achievement Medal (with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters), Army Good Conduct Medal, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal (with 3 Bonze Service Stars), Armed Forces Reserve Medal (with "M" Device), and the Air Assault Badge.

In his civilian capacity, Chief Colon retired as a federal law enforcement officer with Homeland Security Investigations in Tampa, Florida, in July 2021, and started a second career as an AML Compliance Manager with USAA.
