SIR: In compliance with section 194 of the Revised Statutes, I have the honor to transmit herewith lists of the names of the clerks and other persons employed in the War Department and its offices from December 1, 1892, to November 30, 1893, and showing the time that each person was actually employed and the sums paid to each.

With reference to that portion of the statute requiring it to be stated whether the services of any of these employés "can be dispensed with without detriment to the public service, and whether the removal of any individuals and the appointment of others in their stead is required for the better dispatch of business," it is remarked that where necessary for the better dispatch of business changes have been made, but I am not now advised by the bureau officers that any further changes are deemed necessary in the interests of the public service.
