SIR,

I have the honor to lay before you the names of the gentlemen now employed as clerks in this office, and the salary each receives, under the present arrangement:

These gentlemen were employed in this office during the war, and have been constantly on duty, and receiving, one 1,200 dollars, and the other 1,100 dollars per annum, until reduced during the last session of Congress.

I take the liberty to invite your attention to this subject, and to state, that the duties of these gentlemen are as constant and as arduous now as at any former period, and I should be wanting in duty to them, if I failed to ask your influence to have their pay increased. The deduction they have experienced is a serious inconvenience, and places them lower than other clerks of equal merit in the other departments of the government.
