The Land Combat Electronic Missile System Repairer performs or supervises maintenance on the Improved Target Acquisition System, Javelin Command Launch Unit (CLU), Long Range Advanced Scout Surveillance System (LRAS3), Modified Improved Target Acquisition System (MITAS), related night sights, and ancillary test equipment. Skills include performing Quality Control (QC) measures, inspecting, testing, and adjusting components to specific tolerances. Repairs unserviceable items by removing and replacing defective components and parts. Repairs unserviceable optical and infrared components by aligning, adjusting, removing and replacing defective modules and assemblies. Personnel learn to determine shortcomings and malfunctions in electronic, electrical, mechanical, pneumatic, optical, and electro-mechanical assemblies, sub- assemblies, modules, and circuit elements.

Repairs defective equipment by adjusting, aligning, repairing, or replacing defective components. Soldiers use skills to test repaired equipment to ensure compliance with technical specifications and if required evacuates equipment and components to higher level repair activities. Ensures ATC equipment is ready for Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) flight inspections.
