Army Information Update

Because information is power, we are informing you each personally and inspiring you to pass it along.

<u>WHAT IS EFMP:</u> The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) is a program that works with other military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated community support, housing, educational and medical services to Families with special needs. **There are approximately 47,200 Servicemembers and 58,400 Family members enrolled in EFMP.**

EFMP FORMS:

- EFMP Enrollment: DD Form 2792 (Family Member Medical Summary)
- Overseas Family Member Travel Screening (FMTS): <u>DA Form 5888</u>
 - This is mandatory and must be completed before the Soldier can receive orders.
 Do not delay once you receive word you are to be stationed overseas. Your installation ACS can help direct you as needed. Find your installation ACS.
- Disenrollment You or your Family may be disenrolled if:
 - o The condition has resolved. This must be verified using one of the forms below.
 - The Family member is no longer in DEERS. This does not automatically happen!
 The Soldier MUST submit one of the forms below to verify the DEERS change.
 - o Disenrollment Forms:
 - DD FORM 2792 for medical disenrollment.
 - DD FORM 2792-1 for educational disenrollment

EFMP RESOURCES:

- <u>E-EFMP Website:</u> The system can complete EFMP enrollment, enrollment update, disenrollment, assignment inquiry, and overseas FMTS. EFMP Families have 24/7 computer-based access to E-EFMP using the DOD self-service log-on.
