Dr. Edward Salo is a Professor of history, Assistant Chair of the history department, and Associate Director of the Heritage Studies PhD Program at Arkansas State University. He is a former President of the Faculty Senate at A-State. Before coming to Arkansas State, Dr. Salo spent 14 years working for several cultural resources management firms across the US. In addition to his teaching, Ed has been active in defense and national security debate. He hosts the "Sea Control Podcast" from the Center for International Maritime Security, a member of New America's Nuclear Security Futures Group, and a former research fellow for both the Modern War Institute at West Point and the Joint Special Operations University.
