Leading Army Defense Cooperation

- The Army Security Assistance Enterprise (ASAE) is composed of over 50 organizations and 5,000 professionals supporting the U.S. Army's mission of managing Security Assistance and Armaments Cooperation (SA/AC) programs and facilitating the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) process.
- These programs are vital to building partner nation capacity and enhancing regional stability. The ASAE, in its execution of SC/SA and FMS, is essential for supporting U.S. national security and foreign policy objectives and contributing to global stability.
- The Assistant Secretary of the Army for Acquisition, Logistics and Technology (ASA (ALT)) has appointed
 the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Defense Exports and Cooperation (DASA (DEC)) to lead
 the ASAE, shaping international defense cooperation and security assistance efforts.

Building Strategic Partnerships

- **DASA(DEC)** is the Army's partner-focused leader for strategic security cooperation. DASA(DEC) ensures the ASAE supports U.S. national security objectives and enhances partner nation defense capabilities through strategic leadership, policy development, and interagency coordination.
- The ASAE integrates with key Army commands to provide military equipment, training, and support, ensuring effective collaboration with partner forces.
