Brigadier General Marne L. Suttin

Director, Network C4 Services and Integration



Brigadier General Marne Suttin assumed duties as Director of Network Command, Control, Communications, and Computer (C4) Services and Integration in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-6, on 2 December 2024. She is responsible for strategy, policy, and guidance to enable mission command across the Army's Global Enterprise Network. Previously she served as the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-6 and Chief Information Officer at U.S. Army Forces Command.

BG Suttin was born at Fort Gordon (now Fort Eisenhower), Georgia into a military family. She graduated from the University of Washington and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Signal Corps.

Her first assignment was to Camp Red Cloud, Korea as a Platoon Leader in D Company, 122nd Signal Battalion, 2nd Infantry Division. She was then assigned to Fort Bragg, North Carolina as a Brigade Assistant Operations Officer in the 35th Signal Brigade, and then as the A Company Executive Officer and Battalion S4 for the 327th Signal Battalion. She was then assigned to Germany where she served as the Brigade S6 for the 1st Armored Division Artillery. She then took Command of A Company, 32nd Signal Brigade, and deployed to Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) from 2003 to 2004. Following Command, she served as the Brigade S6 for the 130th Engineer Brigade.

BG Suttin was selected for the Joint Staff Intern program where she received a Masters in Public Policy from Georgetown University, then served as a Congressional Liaison with the House of Representatives. Her next assignment was to III Corps at Fort Hood, Texas, as a Planner in the G-5 and Commander's Action Group, during which time she deployed to OIF in 2010. She then was assigned to 2nd Brigade (Black Jack), 1st Cavalry Division, as the Brigade S6 and the Brigade Rear Detachment Commander. After moving to MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa, Florida, BG Suttin served in the J6 for U.S. Special Operations Command Central (SOCCENT) before taking command of the 2nd Joint Communications Squadron. As Commander of 2nd JCS, she deployed a joint force to establish the communications architecture for Operation United Assistance in Liberia in 2014. In 2017, BG Suttin took command of the U.S. Army Garrison in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. She was then assigned to NORAD and U.S. Northern Command, where she served as the Division Chief, Theater Strategy and Campaign Plans (J53), and as the Chief of Information Technology and Mission Services (J66).

BG Suttin's military education includes the Signal Officer Basic Course, U.S. Army Airborne School, U.S. Army Jumpmaster School, Marine Corps Command and Control Systems Course, Combined Arms and Services Staff School, Command and General Staff College, and School of Advanced Military Studies. She attended the University of Texas-Austin fellowship program for Senior Service College.

She and her husband, BG Grant Fawcett, have two children.
