Mr. John Stoneburg assumed duties of the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army (Military Personnel & Quality of Life) on 19 May 2024. In this role, Mr. Stoneburg provides policy, supervision, and oversight of military human resources programs including medical and health affairs, recruiting and retention, quality of life, and casualty affairs for the Total Force. He additionally provides policy oversight for voluntary education, child and youth services, morale, welfare, and recreation. He is also a member of the Board of Directors for Army & Air Force Exchange System and Defense Commissary Agency. Mr. Stoneburg has served the U.S. Army as an enlisted Soldier, officer, and Civil Servant for over 30 years. He last served on active duty as a Military Police Corps officer, culminating with his last assignment on the Army Staff before retiring in 2012. He entered the Civil Service immediately following his military retirement. Mr. Stoneburg managed resources and force structure for the last 15 years as a senior force manager on the Army Staff.
