Mr. Mansfield serves as a university spokesman at Kent State University in Kent, Ohio, and leads university's content team as the Assistant Vice President, Content Strategy and Communications. This opportunity followed a 20-year career as a frontline journalist, most notably as an Emmy award-winning anchor/reporter with WKYC (NBC) in Cleveland, Ohio. Mr. Mansfield often reflects on the service of soldiers, veterans and their families through his work as a professional playwright and member of the Dramatist Guild in New York City. Mansfield has written more than a dozen full-length plays and received the Jean Kennedy Smith National Playwrighting Award (2nd place) for his original play, "Baron of Brown Street," which was inspired by the true story of Army veteran Lenny King, a homeless man who survived an attack in which he was set on fire. Additionally, Mansfield's original play, "Love in Reserve," which chronicles the life and challenges of an Army couple separated during the first year of Operation Iraqi Freedom was named a national semifinalist for the Bridge Award by Arts in the Armed Forces, a national organization led by actor Adam Driver which supports military members and their families through the arts. This play also received the Award of Best New Play by a Local Playwright by the Cleveland Critics Circle.

EDUCATION

Mr. Mansfield earned a Master's Degree in Public Relations from Kent State University in 2012 and a Bachelor's Degree in Journalism from the University of Dayton in 1991. He is currently pursuing a Master of Fine Arts (MFA) degree from Kent State University.

MILITARY SERVICE

Mr. Mansfield enlisted at age 17 into the Ohio Army National Guard and served for 20 years before retiring in 2006. As an enlisted soldier, Eric deployed to Honduras and to state emergencies as a Military Police officer. Mr. Mansfield earned his commission via Ohio's Officer Candidate School (OCS), where he was named honor graduate and class president. Mr. Mansfield spent three years as an MP platoon leader followed by two years as an instructor at the Ohio Military Academy. On 9/11, Mr. Mansfield was serving in the final year of his three-year assignment as the commander of the 1484th Transportation Company in Akron, Ohio. From 2003-2004, Mr. Mansfield deployed to Operation Iraqi Freedom as a transportation logistics officer with the 371th Corps Support Group. After completing EO/EEO training with the Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute (DEOMI) in 2005, Mr. Mansfield led a transportation cell in southern Mississippi as part of the military response to Hurricane Katrina. In 2006, Mr. Mansfield retired from the military as a Major (O-4) while assigned as an EO officer to Troop Command, Ohio Army National Guard.
