SUBJECT: 2013 Focus Area Review Group Reclama and 25 Percent Final Reduction Decisions

- 1. On 14 August 2013, the Secretary of the Army and Chief of Staff, Army, chartered the 2013 Army Focus Area Review Group (FARG) to provide recommendations to reduce and consolidate Army headquarters organizations, programs, and functions in expectation of dramatically reduced funding levels. One element of this effort was the directive to reduce Army Headquarters at the 2-star and Tier-2 Senior Executive Service (SES) level and above in the aggregate by 25%.
- 2. Army commands and staffs must understand that as a result of sharply reduced funding; there will be additional civilian and military reductions applied in the Army program. These additional reductions will be addressed in the POM FY 16-20 process by the Planning, Programming and Budget Committee (PPBC).
- 3. On 22 November 2013, we provided commands and organizations an opportunity to submit reclamas to the proposed headquarter reductions. Twenty-five reclamas were submitted. In some cases, organizations also included reclama requests for subordinate organizations. We considered each reclama carefully and have reached the decisions set forth below.
- 4. Final Decisions on Reclamas:
 - a. The following reclamas are approved, in whole or in part as indicated. (Refer to Enclosure 1 for more detailed numerical information and approved authorized HQ strength.)

5. We have approved the directed reductions to all Army Headquarters led by a Major General or Tier 2 member of the Senior Executive Service. We direct that these reductions be taken during fiscal years 2015-2019 in the headquarters of the organizations identified in the Focus Area Reduction spreadsheet (Enclosure 1). Organizations will apply reductions in FY15 and FY16 to the position level. Reductions for FY17 through FY19 will be applied at the organization/UIC level. This will

allow organizations to conduct thorough transformational analysis and comprehensive reviews of missions and functions to inform potential redesign and reorganization. Detailed guidance is provided in enclosure 2 to ensure reductions are in accordance with Army Planning, Programming, Budgeting and Execution and Force Management processes. Enclosure 3 directs the approved Army Service Component Command reductions. Reductions entail the elimination of the authorization, removal of the individual for encumbered positions, and the decrement of resources associated with the full-time equivalent. Implementation Plans will be reviewed by both the Under Secretary and Vice Chief of Staff for each organization, starting in June 2014. HQDA reductions and reorganization for FY17 and beyond (Secretariat/ARSTAFF/FOA) will be based on a comprehensive review of missions, tasks, and current/planned organization led by the USA and VCSA; details to be provided separately.

- 6. The intent is to reduce the size of Army Headquarters-both authorizations and personnel; therefore Commands and organizations cannot reduce subordinate organizations to meet the directed targets. As reductions occur, Commanders and Principal Officials should review their workload and reduce or eliminate lower priority efforts.
- 7. We acknowledge that workforce reductions are never easy. Commanders and leaders must ensure that our people are treated with dignity and respect befitting the quality of their service as we implement these difficult measures.

Enclosure 2 2013 Focus Area Review Group Reclama and 25 Percent Reduction Decisions Implementation Instructions

- 1. The implementation of reductions reduces headquarters authorizations and associated resources and must be properly documented in the databases of record (SAMAS and PROBE).
- 2. All Army commands and organizations must achieve the specified headquarters reductions IAW with prescribed drawdown ramps. For institutional headquarters, reductions are to be executed in a uniform manner during FYs 15-19 in line with fiscal constraints and end strength targets.
- 3. All Army organizations must comply with DCS, G-3/5/7 Force Management directives in support of implementation.
 - a. TRADOC continues development and submits Force Design Updates (FDU) for Corps/Div HQs. Submit to HQDA G-3/5/7 NLT 31 July 2014.
 - b. USAFMSA develops TOEs in parallel with FDU.
 - c. DAMO-FM document new MTOEs/TDAs reflecting reductions for publication in Command Plan (CP) 16 and CP17.
- 4. Grade plate growth is not permitted in conjunction with these reductions.
- 5. These reductions decrease the Army's institutional overhead across the enterprise. Requests by organizations to increase authorizations will be reviewed as part of the normal manpower processes.
- 6. Army organizations must comply with DCS, G-8 Program Analysis and Evaluation Directorate (PAED) directives for implementation in the Army Program.
- 7. Reductions to military authorizations assigned to Title 11 support should be realigned to other organizations to ensure the Army maintains required Title 11 support to our Reserve Components.
- 8. Reductions to Army National Guard and Army Reserve full-time headquarters will be taken from full-time personnel.
- 9. Reductions to Army National Guard and Army Reserve. Reductions in Active Guard and Reserve (AGR) authorizations will be coordinated between the staff element and the affected Reserve Component (ARNG or USAR). Reductions in AGR authorizations will remain proportionate to the reductions of Active Component positions. Reductions will only be booked as a headquarters reduction and not as a reduction to the overall number of resourced AGRs; the Reserve Components will be permitted to retain and realign retained AGR authorizations to support Troop Program Units, etc. Any exceptions to the AGR guidelines will be adjudicated by the USA and VCSA.
