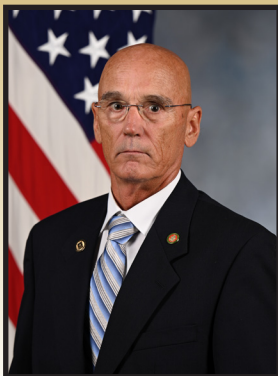

Follow-on leadership positions included the Command Sergeant Major for the 867th QM Battalion and the 67th Support Group, the Training and Doctrine Command Sergeant Major for the 209th Regiment, the 6th State Command Sergeant Major for Nebraska, and the 9th Command Sergeant Major of the Army National Guard of the United States.
