

## Lisa DaPonte Acting Product Lead Logistics Modernization Program (LMP)



Ms. Lisa DaPonte is the acting product lead for the U.S. Army's Logistics Modernization Program (LMP), one of the largest enterprise resource planning (ERP) implementations in the U.S. Army and across the Army Materiel Command's (AMC) national-level logistics environment. In this role, she oversees day-to-day operations for the management and execution of funding, contracts, priorities, schedules, personnel, facilities and work performed by the LMP and various supporting organizations. She also interacts with senior stakeholders at AMC, as well as the Office of the Secretary of the Defense (OSD), Headquarters Department of the Army (HQDA), and other Department of Defense (DoD) agencies and Congress.

Ms. DaPonte has spent nearly 20 years with the LMP Product Management Office (PMO), working her way up through the ranks from intern at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, to acting product lead at Picatinny Arsenal, New Jersey. She most recently served as LMP Systems Engineering Division chief where she oversaw the interdisciplinary approach encompassing the LMP's entire functional and technical efforts to integrate a balanced set of system, people, and process solutions. She also previously served as the LMP Projects Management Division chief where she led the LMP's strategic planning and organizational development in order to plan, manage, and monitor project implementations across the LMP system. She served as the Supply Team lead for the LMP Systems Engineering Division where she supported solution development, requirements management, functional security roles, training, and data work efforts. She also filled in as the Systems Engineering Division acting chief for a short time. She also held the positions of Functional Integration Branch lead, Integrated System Supply Team lead, and Supply System lead analyst. Throughout her LMP tenure, she has worked with, led, and/or supported every LMP business area functional team in every phase of the program's lifecycle.

Ms. DaPonte holds a bachelor's degree from Loyola College, is a certified Project Management Professional (PMP), and is Level III Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act (DAWIA) certified in Lifecycle Logistics.
