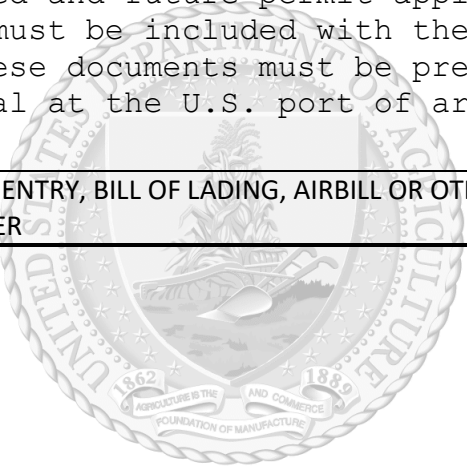

- \*\*\*Each shipment shall be accompanied by an ORIGINAL certificate endorsed by a full-time, salaried veterinarian of the U.S. Army, DOD, certifying that the beef samples being shipped to the United States were of U.S. origin and were not commingled with meat from any other countries. [This certification must CLEARLY correspond to the shipment by means of an invoice number or shipping marks or lot number or other identification method. An English translation must be provided.]
- Imported material exposed to or derived from ruminants originating in any country listed below may NOT be used, either directly or indirectly in ANY animals due to the presence or significant risk of bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) in these countries. Work shall be limited to IN VITRO uses only.
- BSE countries/regions include Albania, Andorra, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Denmark, the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, the Republic of Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Monaco, Netherlands, Norway, Oman, Poland, Portugal, Romania, the Republic of San Marino, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom [includes Great Britain (England, Scotland, Wales, Isle of Man), Northern Ireland, and the Falklands].
- Importer is responsible for obtaining any required authorization from the USDA, Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS). FSIS may have specific public health requirements apart from USDA's animal health requirements for the permitted product. Importer to contact [(202) 720-9904 or (202) 720-3473].
- This permit is valid only for work conducted or directed by you or your designee in your present U.S. facilities. (MATERIALS SHALL NOT BE MOVED TO ANOTHER U.S. LOCATION, OR DISTRIBUTED WITHIN THE U.S., WITHOUT USDA, APHIS, VS, NCIE AUTHORIZATION.)
- On completion of your work, all permitted materials and all derivatives therefrom shall be destroyed.
- The restrictions on this permit remain in force as long as the material is in the United States.
- This permit does not exempt the permittee from responsibility for compliance with any other applicable federal, state, or local laws and regulations.
- Any person who VIOLATES the terms and conditions of permits, and/or who forge, counterfeit, or deface permits may be subject to criminal and civil

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penalties in accordance with applicable law. In addition, all current permits may be cancelled and future permit applications denied.

- A copy of this permit must be included with the shipping documents. For imported materials, these documents must be presented to CBP Agricultural Specialists upon arrival at the U.S. port of arrival.
