- ***Permit does not authorize importation of fresh, chilled, or frozen meat from poultry or swine unless the country of origin is recognized by USDA as being free of FMD, HC, SVD, ASF (swine meat), or ND & HPAI (poultry meat). Meat samples in countries not free of above diseases must be cooked or cured/dried as specified in Section 94.4, 94.8, 94.9, and 94.12 (swine meat) and 94.6 (poultry meat) of Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations.
- ***Each shipment of pork or poultry exported from disease affected-countries (diseases mentioned above) must be accompanied by an ORIGINAL signed document from the producer/manufacturer confirming that the meat products shall have been thoroughly cooked after removal of bones by a commercial method to reach an internal minimum core temperature of 80°C as used for perishable canned pork products in the case of pork products, and 70°C for 5 seconds in the case of poultry products. [This documentation must CLEARLY correspond to the shipment by means of an invoice number or shipping marks or lot number or other identification method. An English translation must be provided.]
- ***Each shipment of milk/milk products exported from foot-and-mouth disease affected-countries must be accompanied by an ORIGINAL signed document from the producer/manufacturer confirming that the sample of milk in the exported product was subjected to a pasteurization process and/or was heat treated prior to exportation to the United States. [This document must CLEARLY correspond to the shipment by means of an invoice number or shipping marks or lot number or other identification method.]
- The imported milk/milk products are for EVALUATION PURPOSES ONLY. Permit does not authorize use as livestock feed ingredient or in veterinary pharmaceuticals. Product may not be sold or distributed.
- No equine blood material may be imported from or through any country/region which is considered by USDA to be affected with African Horse Sickness disease.
- Importer is responsible for obtaining any required authorization from the USDA, Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS). FSIS may have specific public health requirements apart from USDA's animal health requirements for the permitted product. Importer to contact [(202) 720-9904 or (202) 720-3473].

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- This permit DOES NOT authorize direct or indirect exposure of or inoculation into laboratory and domestic livestock, including poultry, cattle, sheep, swine, horses, etc. Work shall be limited to IN VITRO uses only.
- This permit is valid only for work conducted or directed by you or your designee in your present U.S. facilities. (MATERIALS SHALL NOT BE MOVED TO ANOTHER U.S. LOCATION, OR DISTRIBUTED WITHIN THE U.S., WITHOUT USDA, APHIS, VS, NCIE AUTHORIZATION.)
