## **250 YEARS OF SACRED SERVICE**



#### JULY 29, 1775

The Continental Congress established the Chaplain Corps.

#### MARCH 4, 1791

After serving as a Chaplain in the Continental Army, John Hurt of Virginia became the U.S. Army's first Chaplain.

#### DECEMBER 21, 1881

James Naismith invented Basketball and later served as a Chaplain in 1916 with the Army National Guard.

#### MARCH 11, 1902

Corporal Calvin Titus was awarded the Medal of honor for his bravery and actions during The Boxer Rebellion.

### DECEMBER 28, 1909

Chaplain assistants were authorized to serve as special duty personnel supporting Chaplains.

### OCTOBER, 1917

Chaplain Francis Duffy served with the Fighting 69th NY National Guard. In 1932 Duffy died, and one of the largest funeral processions in NY history took place. In 1937, a statue was placed in Times Square between 45th and 47th Streets.

### **FEBRUARY 9, 1918**

The Chaplain School was established at Fort Monroe, Virginia. It was the first fully integrated Army school.

### JULY 15, 1920

The Office of the Chief of Chaplains was established by the National Defense Act of 1920, and the Chaplain Corps became an official branch of the Army. Chaplain (Colonel) John Axton became the first Chief of Chaplains.







#### **FEBRUARY 3, 1943**

The Four Chaplains gave their lives to save their shipmates when the troop ship Dorchester was sunk by a German U-boat.

#### MAY 23, 1951

Chaplain (Captain) Emil Kapaun died in Pyoktong, North Korea, while in POW camp caring for prisoners.

#### MAY, 1952

Private Berry Gordy, founder of Motown, served in the Korean War as a Chaplain Assistant. His duties included playing the portable organ.

#### NOVEMBER 19, 1967

Chaplain (Major) Charles Watters gave his life in Vietnam ministering to troops on the front lines. He was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor.

#### JULY 8, 1974

Chaplain (Captain) Alice Henderson was commissioned at Fort Hamilton, New York.

**1974** The concept of the Unit Ministry Team (UMT) was established in Army doctrine to assign Chaplain and Chaplain Assistant teams to units throughout all components of the Army.

OCTOBER 1, 2017 Chaplain Assistants were redesignated Religious Affairs Specialists.

JUNE 1, 2023 The US. Army Chaplain Center and School was redesignated the U.S. Army Institute for Religious Leadership.
