Colonel Kevin J. Consedine Commander

COL Kevin Consedine serves as an Army Aviation Officer with FAA ratings spanning helicopters, airplanes, and seaplanes. He commissioned through ROTC, graduating from the Virginia Military Institute in 2001, and holds a Master's in Public Administration from the University of Washington's Evans School of Public Policy and Governance.

COL Consedine has a diverse military background encompassing multiple combat leadership roles with the 1st Cavalry, 101st and 82nd Combat Aviation Brigades. He also worked with the Defense Threat Reduction Agency developing rapid solutions, as part of a joint, interagency process, to defeat improvised-threats and develop counter-UAS technology. Additionally, COL Consedine served as Professor of Military Science at Oregon State University where he coordinated and implemented a leader development program for over 100 ROTC Cadets.



His most recent tactical assignment was as battalion commander of 3-82nd Combat Aviation Brigade in Afghanistan, where he synchronized the operations, personnel, and maintenance for the largest aviation formation in the 82nd Airborne Division. COL Consedine's other deployments include Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF I, 06-08, and 09-10), Operation Enduring Freedom (12-13), and Operation Inherent Resolve (2016).

Following battalion command, COL Consedine was selected as a Senior Service College Fellow at Duke University as part of the Sanford School of Public Policy and Counterterrorism. Prior to assuming command of Corpus Christi Army Depot in 2024 he served as the Operations and Readiness Division Chief in HQDA G 3/5/7 (DAMO-AV). His awards, decorations and skills are commensurate with an officer of his background and experience.
