

Chapter 4

Officer Skill identifiers (SI)

4-1. Use of skills

a. Use of a SI for positions in authorization documents and criteria governing establishment of a skill is prescribed in AR 611-1.

b. Officers may receive skill classification through one of the following procedures:

(1) Officers will be classified with the proper skill upon successful completion at required skill qualification course certified by the school commandant, or the commander of the unit to which the officer is assigned.

(2) As a result of successful completion of civil schooling, per AR 611-1.

(3) As a result of work experience or contract training per classification guidance for the skill and AR 611-1.

c. Officer skill identifiers may only be withdrawn by Human Resources Command (Active and USAR) or National Guard Bureau (NG). When a commander determines that an officer is no longer qualified in the SI, a request to withdraw the SI with justification will be forwarded through channels to the appropriate approval authority.

d. Reference skill tables.

(1) See table 4-1 for an alphabetical listing of skills.

(2) Table 4-2 lists the criteria for designation of the degree of proficiency for AMEDD officer.

(3) Table 4-3 is a numerical listing of skills that includes the code, title, proponent, description, qualification and restriction. Skill identifiers awarded only by CG, HRC-Alexandria are shown in the restrictions paragraph.

(4) Table 4-4 lists the criteria for designation of the degree of proficiency for Judge Advocate General's Corps officers.

(5) Table 4-5 lists all officer SI with gender identification, implementation date, rescinded date and personnel/structure utilization data.

Criteria for Degree of Proficiency for AMEDD Officers

NOTE: The Medical Proficiency Designator (MPD) is not an Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) and should not be recorded in Total Army Personnel Data Base (or its successor) as such.

Branch Skill Code: 9A (for personnel only)

Medical Corps, 60-62:

Determination by The Surgeon General's Classification Board on an individual basis in accordance with (IAW) OTSG Regulation 15-35.

Dental Corps, 63:

Determination by The Surgeon General's Classification Board on an individual basis in accordance with (IAW) OTSG Regulation 15-35.

Veterinary Corps, 64:

Determination by The Surgeon General's Classification Board on an individual basis IAW OTSG Regulation 15-35.

Army Medical Specialist Corps, 65:

Determination by The Surgeon General's Classification Board on an individual basis IAW OTSG Regulation 15-35.

Army Nurse Corps, 66:

Determination by The Surgeon General's Classification Board on an individual basis IAW OTSG Regulation 15-35.

Medical Service Corps, 67:

Determination by The Surgeon General's Classification Board on an individual basis IAW OTSG Regulation 15-35.

Branch Skill Code: 9B (for personnel only)

Medical Corps, 60-62:

- (1) Certification by the American Specialty Board in a particular specialty or,
- (2) Certification in the subspecialty controlling American Specialty Board.

Dental Corps, 63:

Certification by a board listed in Dental Corps MPD 9C.

Veterinary Corps, 64:

- (1) Certification by a recognized specialty board of the American Veterinary Medical Association or,
- (2) Award of the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree in a discipline of AOC 64E only.

Army Medical Specialist Corps, 65:

Officers with a post-professional doctorate (PhD, DSc, ScD, EdD, etc.) degree, beyond that required to practice in the specified AOC.

Army Nurse Corps, 66:

Board Certification in a specialty matching the specialty of their primary AOC or their specialty skill identifier. It is the responsibility of the board certified officer to maintain current certification documents. An annual review by AN Branch of current certifications will result in removal of expired certifications from the ORB.

Medical Service Corps, 67:

Award of board certifications by a recognized specialty board acceptable to The Surgeon General in a particular specialty. It is the responsibility of the board certified officer to maintain current certification documents. An annual review by MS Branch of current certifications will result in removal of expired certifications from the ORB.

Branch Skill Code: 9C (for personnel only)

Medical Corps, 60-62:

- (1) Completion of formal training to meet the American Specialty Board requirements of approved residency or fellowship in a recognized teaching center in the professional field or,
- (2) Completion of formal subspecialty training to meet the American Specialty Board requirements.

Dental Corps, 63:

Completion of an approved dental postgraduate residency program of at least two continuous years which meets the eligibility requirements of a specialty board approved by the American Dental Association or the American Board of General Dentistry.

Veterinary Corps, 64:

Officers classified in AOC 64B, 64C, 64D, and 64F eligible to apply for examination for certification by a specialty board approved by the American Veterinary Medical Association based on the specific specialty board requirements.

Army Medical Specialist Corps, 65:

(1) Certification by a recognized specialty board and/or non-degree granting subspecialty fellowship for their respective AOC or, (2) Award of additional graduate degree at the Master's level (MS, MBA, MHA, etc.) beyond that required to practice in the specified AOC.

Army Nurse Corps, 66:

Fully qualified to hold the AOC but not eligible for award of MPD 9B.

Medical Service Corps, 67:

Completion of an approved internship or residency training program which meets the requirements of a specialty board acceptable to The Surgeon General. After attaining full licensure and independent practice status, the officer will be awarded MPD 9C.

Branch Skill Code: 9D (for personnel only)

Medical Corps, 60-62:

(1) Includes all personnel in specialty/AOC training, following completion of first year of graduate medical education (FYGME), in a recognized teaching center or completion of 18 months of duty or practice limited to the professional specialty indicated by AOC 60D, 60J, 60K, 60L, 60N, 60P, 60S, 60T, 60V, 60W, 61F, 61H, 61J, 61M, 61P, 61Q, 61R, 61U, 61Z or 62A or,

(2) AOC 60C - Approved residency or fellowship in public health, degree of Master of Public Health, or graduate of the U.S. Army Medical Department (AMEDD) Center and School Course 6A-F5, Principles of Military Preventive Medicine, or by possession of knowledge, skills, experience and/or credentials that are at a level recognized by OTSG or,

(3) AOC 61N - Approved residency in aviation medicine at either the Naval Operational Medicine Institute or the U.S. Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine. Completion of aviation medicine training at the U.S. Army Aeromedical Center. All participants must be medically qualified for flying duty in accordance with AR 40-501, chapter 4.

Dental Corps, 63:

Completion of a formal training program approved by the American Dental Association Council of at least 12 months duration to augment proficiency in the AOC.

Veterinary Corps, 64:

Upon starting a formal training program. Indicated for AOC 64B, 64C, 64D, 64E, and 64F.

Army Medical Specialist Corps, 65:

Officers who have completed necessary training to be fully qualified in their respective AOC and successfully pass their national board examination but are not yet eligible for awarding of MPD 9B or 9C.

Army Nurse Corps, 66:

Currently participating in a course of instruction 13 months or longer that leads to the award of an AOC or advanced degree.

Medical Service Corps, 67:

(1) National Certification as a Case Manager by the, American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) or the Commission for Case Manager Certification (CCMC)

(2) Completion of a formal case management training course such as the Army Nurse Case Manager Course or an alternate certification producing Case Management Course approved by Case Management Consultant to the Surgeon General.

The clinical informatics specialty leverages the officer's knowledge of clinical and business processes within health systems to optimize use of computer science, information systems, and related technology to promote health systems through clinical and business intelligence. The focus of the graduate trained informatics officer is not the computer itself, or an individual piece of healthcare technology device, hardware, or software system. As a functional advocate, consultant, liaison, and sponsor for the clinical end users, including service members, patients, caregivers, and healthcare industry best practices Clinical Informatics Officers administer and manage clinical functions, codify requirements to the Information Technology (IT) community; lead acquisitions; lead clinical system testing, implementation, training, and support; lead clinical systems adoption, human factors evaluation, and user integration; and lead system life cycle management and operation.

b. *Qualifications.* AMEDD officers who have completed the following:

(1) Masters or Advanced Degree in Healthcare Informatics (clinical, health, medical, dental, nursing, public health or other healthcare disciplines).

(2) National board certification in a health informatics specialty (e.g. American Board of Medical Specialties, American Board of Pathology, American Board of Pharmacy Specialties, American Nurses Credentialing Center's Nursing Informatics Certification. The American Medical Informatics Association and American Nursing Informatics Association's Informatics online certificates and 10 x 10 continuing education programs cannot be substituted for formal specialty degrees/education.

(3) One-year experience in an AMEDD Military Health System clinical informatics position (applied utilization).

 - (a) Professional (Doctoral) level degree in medicine or clinical psychology (MD/DO, PhD/PsyD).
 - (b) Completion of an approved post-graduate fellowship in Forensic Psychiatry or Forensic Psychology, or an equivalent combination of training and experience as determined by the OTSG Consultant for Forensic Psychiatry.

These personnel augment the emergency physician's operational reach and cares for high volumes of patients requiring urgent and emergency care. Emergency Nurse Practitioners (ENPs) triage, perform complete physical examinations, analyze diagnostic tests, formulate treatment plans, implement plans of care, and collaborate with other health professionals and refer patients as appropriate.

b. *Qualifications:* Be able to perform duties described above and possess the following qualifications:

(1) Have a Master's Degree or higher in nursing. Must be prepared and nationally certified as a Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP).

1. Must have completed a training program through an approved, accredited graduate or post graduate ENP program or

2. Must have completed and approved advanced practice fellowship program in emergency care. The program will be accredited by approved national accrediting body.

(3) The provision of completing 2,000 direct, emergency care clinical practice hours as a Family Nurse Practitioner in the past five (5) years, will not meet eligibility requirements alone.

(4) ENPs are required to submit a copy of their following certifications: Emergency Nurse Practitioner-Board Certified (ENP-BC) from the American Academy of Nurse Practitioner Certification Board (AANPCB), Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), Advanced Life Support (ALS), Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) (recommended), and Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) or Advanced Pediatric Life Support (APLS) (recommended).

Title: Acute Care Nurse Practitioner (ACNP)

Proponent: Office of the Surgeon General (OTSG)

a. *Description of positions.* There are no positions identified for SI N9. For use with personnel only.

Identifies duties of the advanced practice nursing personnel who possess special qualification in acute and critical patients. These personnel extend the reach of critical care physicians and relieve procedural and patient management burdens of physicians caring for high volumes of critical patients. When utilized for inpatient or outpatient care outside of the Intensive/Critical Care Unit (ICU/CCU) setting, ACNPs extend the reach of admitting physicians for the care of patients in inpatient units such as telemetry and critical care step-down units and various specialty outpatient clinics. Acute Care Nurse Practitioners (ACNPs) are able to care for patients characterized as physiologically unstable, technologically dependent, and/or highly vulnerable to complications. The range of care for ACNPs includes the provision of care to prevent disease as well as the acute and critical care management to stabilize the patient's condition, prevent complications, restore maximum health, and or provide palliative care. To achieve this, ACNP capabilities include managing acute resuscitations, eliciting comprehensive health histories, performing complete physical examinations, ordering and performing diagnostic tests, analyzing health data, formulating treatment plans, implementing plans of care (to include placement of vascular access and other monitoring or treatment devices), collaborating with other health professionals and referring patients to specialty providers, as appropriate.

b. *Qualifications:* Be able to perform duties described above and possess the following qualifications:

(1) Have a Masters degree or higher in nursing. Must be prepared and attain national board certification in the Adult and or Adult-Gerontological Acute Care population.

(2) Experience and Core Competencies. Must have 1 year of work experience as a nationally certified ACNP in a Critical Care setting, Inpatient unit, Emergency Department or Urgent Care setting. Must provide documentation to verify; documentation must include:

1. Type of practice and specialty of the ACNP

2. Principal patient responsibilities

3. Principal skills and procedures performed

4. Core competencies; must submit verification of core competencies on the checklist approved by the 66H or 66S Consultant to The Surgeon General. The checklist must be completed by the supervising physician and must verify the skills and knowledge of the ACNP currently possesses.

(3) ACNPs who attended a formal education program must submit a copy of their transcript of education. ACNPs who attended a post-graduate ACNP fellowship must submit verification from the supervising program director or physician that outlines the fellowship length and training requirements met, including clinical hours by specialty location/clinical setting.

(4) ACNPs are required to submit a copy of their following certifications: AGACNP, ACNP, ACNPC (Adult), or ACNPC-AG from the American Academy of Nurse Practitioner Certification Board (AANPCB), American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) or American Association of Critical Care Nurses (AACN), Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) preferred, and Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) or Advanced Pediatric Life Support (APLS) preferred.

(5) All packets must be reviewed and approved by the COMPO 1 appointed AN 66H or 66S Consultant to The Surgeon General. Approved memorandum for COMPO 1 and 3 will be routed to HRC, or to State OPM for COMPO 2 for SI award.
