COL Scott Sentell graduated from the United States Military Academy and commissioned as an Armor Officer in May 1997. COL Sentell's initial assignment was with 1st Battalion, 32nd Armor Regiment at Fort Lewis, Washington where he served as a Tank Platoon Leader, Scout Platoon Leader, and Company Executive Officer.



In 2001, COL Sentell was assigned to Fort Hood, Texas where he served as a Plans Officer in III Armored Corps, as well as the Logistics Officer and Assistant Operations Officer for 1st Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. In 2004, COL Sentell assumed command of A Company, 1-8 CAV and deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom II. Upon his return to Fort Hood, COL Sentell assumed command of HHC, 1-8 CAV. From 2006-2008, COL Sentell served as the Deputy Operations Officer for the Mission Command Training Program (MCTP) at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

In 2010, upon graduating from the Command and General Staff College and the School of Advanced Military Studies, COL Sentell was assigned to the 101st ABN DIV (AASLT) at Fort Campbell, Kentucky and deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom as a Future Operations Planner. While deployed, COL Sentell assumed the duties as the Executive Officer for 1st Battalion, 327th Infantry Regiment, 1st BCT (Bastogne), 101st ABN DIV (AASLT). Following their redeployment, COL Sentell served as the Brigade Operations Officer and subsequently as the Brigade Executive Officer for 1st BCT, 101st ABN DIV (AASLT) during their train-up and deployment to Afghanistan from 2012-2013.

In February 2014, COL Sentell assumed command of 6th Squadron, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 2IBCT, 3ID where he remained in command until June 2016. Following command, COL Sentell served as the G5, Chief of Plans for the 3rd Infantry Division. In June 2018, COL Sentell graduated from the National War College, Fort McNair, DC. From 2018-2020, COL Sentell served as the Mission and Enterprise IT Division Chief for the Joint Improvised-Threat Defeat Organization (JIDO) and subsequently as the Chief of Operations, Operations and Integration Directorate, Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA). COL Sentell commanded Task Force Sinai and also served as the Chief of Staff, Multinational Force and Observers in Egypt, 2020-2021. Upon his return from Egypt, COL Sentell served as the Chief, Strategic Initiatives Group, Army Talent Management Task Force from 2021-2023. He currently serves as the G3/5/7 for the Army Futures & Concepts Center.

COL Sentell holds a MA in Security Studies from Kansas State University, a MMAS from the School of Advanced Military Studies, and a MA in National Security Strategy from the National War College. His awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal with two oak leaf clusters, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, Army Commendation and Achievement Medals, the Combat Action Badge, Parachutist Badge and Air Assault Badge.
