



# Mission and Installation Contracting Command

Command Sergeant Major JennyAnne C. Bright serves as the Command Sergeant Major of the U.S. Army Mission and Installation Contracting Command at Joint Base San Antonio-Fort Sam Houston, Texas. The MICC, a subordinate command to the U.S. Army Contracting Command, is comprised of approximately 1,500 uniformed and civilian acquisition and support professionals providing Army commands, installations and activities with responsive business solutions and contracting administration. The MICC consists of two contracting support brigades, two field directorates, 9 contracting battalions and offices across 30 locations within the continental United States. Its brigades, battalions and contracting detachments are strategically aligned to deploy Soldiers in support of mission partners during contingency and humanitarian operations overseas and across the homeland.



Prior to assuming responsibility of the MICC in November 2024, CSM Bright served as the commandant of the Fort Stewart Noncommissioned Officer Academy at Fort Stewart, Georgia from 2021 to 2024.

CSM Bright entered the United States Army on September 9, 1997, from Columbia, Maryland. She attended Basic Combat Training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Lee, Virginia. CSM Bright began her military career as a 43M, Fabric Repair Specialist, which later became the military occupational specialty (MOS) 92S, Shower and Laundry Specialist.
