LIFR cigs will gradually improve, and by 10L, I expect VFR conditions. The rest of the day looks hazard-free til IFR cigs set in again tonight, mainly after midnight. We'll keep this pattern in place thru the weekend. We could see a sprinkle or two today or tonight, but it's nothing that should impact training. Rain chances increase a bit tomorrow and Friday, even more so on Saturday as another cold front nears the area. Winds could reach warning-level criteria (G30kts) Sunday PM behind the front.
