Quality and Transformation



Billy McCain currently serves as the acting assistant capability program executive for quality and transformation at U.S. Army Capability Program Executive Enterprise Software and Services (CPE ES2). In that role, his priorities include the integration and transformation of the organization's Agile footprint, the consolidation of lifecycle tools, and the overall quality and health of the organization.

Before assuming this position, McCain attended the prestigious United States Naval War College, earning his graduate degree in national security and strategic studies from July 2024 to July 2025.

Prior to that, he served as the product support manager in several organizations across the U.S. Army Program Executive Office (PEO) Enterprise portfolio – most recently with Project Manager, Integrated Personnel and Pay System – Army (PM IPPS-A) from February 2023 to July 2024. Before that, he was project manager, Army Data and Analytics Platforms (ARDAP) from June 2020 to February 2023, and prior to that he served as product manager, Global Combat Support System – Army (GCSS-Army) from August 2013 to June 2020.

Before joining PEO Enterprise, McCain served four years (2009-2013) as a combat developer with the Combined Army Support Command at Fort Lee, Virginia, where he was responsible for warfighter requirements, requirements definition, product development, training and the fielding of GCSS-Army's Increment 1 solution.

Before becoming an Army civilian, McCain served 22 years in the U.S. Army, ultimately becoming one of its premier senior logistician and advisors to Army leadership and retiring as a chief warrant officer 4 in 2009. His tours included Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; Fort Hood, Texas; Camp Humphrey, Korea; Fort Carson, Colorado; Hanau, Germany; and Fort Lee, Virginia. His Army career culminated in two tours in Iraq and in his winning the Department of the Army Supply Excellence Award in 2001 for the small/medium supply support activity category.

McCain holds a Bachelor of Science from Excelsior College in Albany, New York, a Master of Science in logistics management from Florida Institute of Technology in Melbourne, Fla. and a Master of Arts in national security and strategic studies from the Naval War College in Newport, Rhode Island. Throughout his career, he has been awarded the Defense Acquisition Workforce Logistician of the Year Award (2018), the Army Acquisition Executive (AAE) Logistician of the Year Award (2017), the International Society of Logistics (SOLE) Logistician of the Year Award (2017), the Meritorious Civilian Service Medal (2022 and 2024), the Army Civilian Commendation Medal (2023) and the Army Civilian Achievement Medal (2022 and 2009). For his tremendous contribution to the logistics field, he was awarded the Distinguished Order of Saint Martin (2009).

Since 2009, McCain has been a member of the Association of Quartermasters and SOLE International Society of Logistics and has served in several leadership roles as a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Incorporated. ★
