

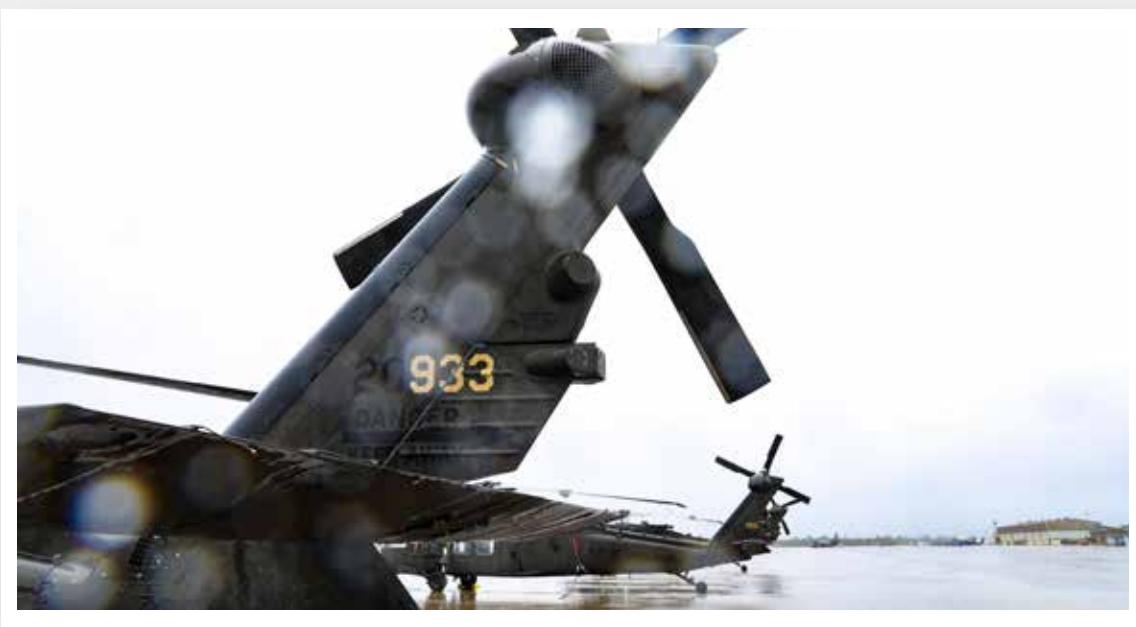
FY25 FIGURES

As the Army celebrates 250 years of defending the nation, our commitment to safeguarding U.S. interests, soldiers, civilians, and families remains steadfast. This commitment extends to U.S. allies and partners through security assistance programs that strengthen collective defense.



FOREIGN MILITARY LANDSCAPE

In FY25, the U.S. Army executed **\$33.6 billion** in new business. The Foreign Military Sales (FMS) enterprise managed over **6,300 active cases** valued at more than **\$306 billion**, supported by over **60,000 active requisitions**.



This significant effort involved collaboration with 134 countries and international organizations, demonstrating the broad scope of U.S. security cooperation efforts. The Army is enhancing partner security with key defense capabilities—air defense systems, ground vehicles including Counter-Unmanned Aircraft System (CUAS), and both manned/unmanned aircraft.

This support includes critical munitions and ammunition to bolster firepower. These deliveries strengthen partner defenses with training and exercises — providing full-spectrum support.

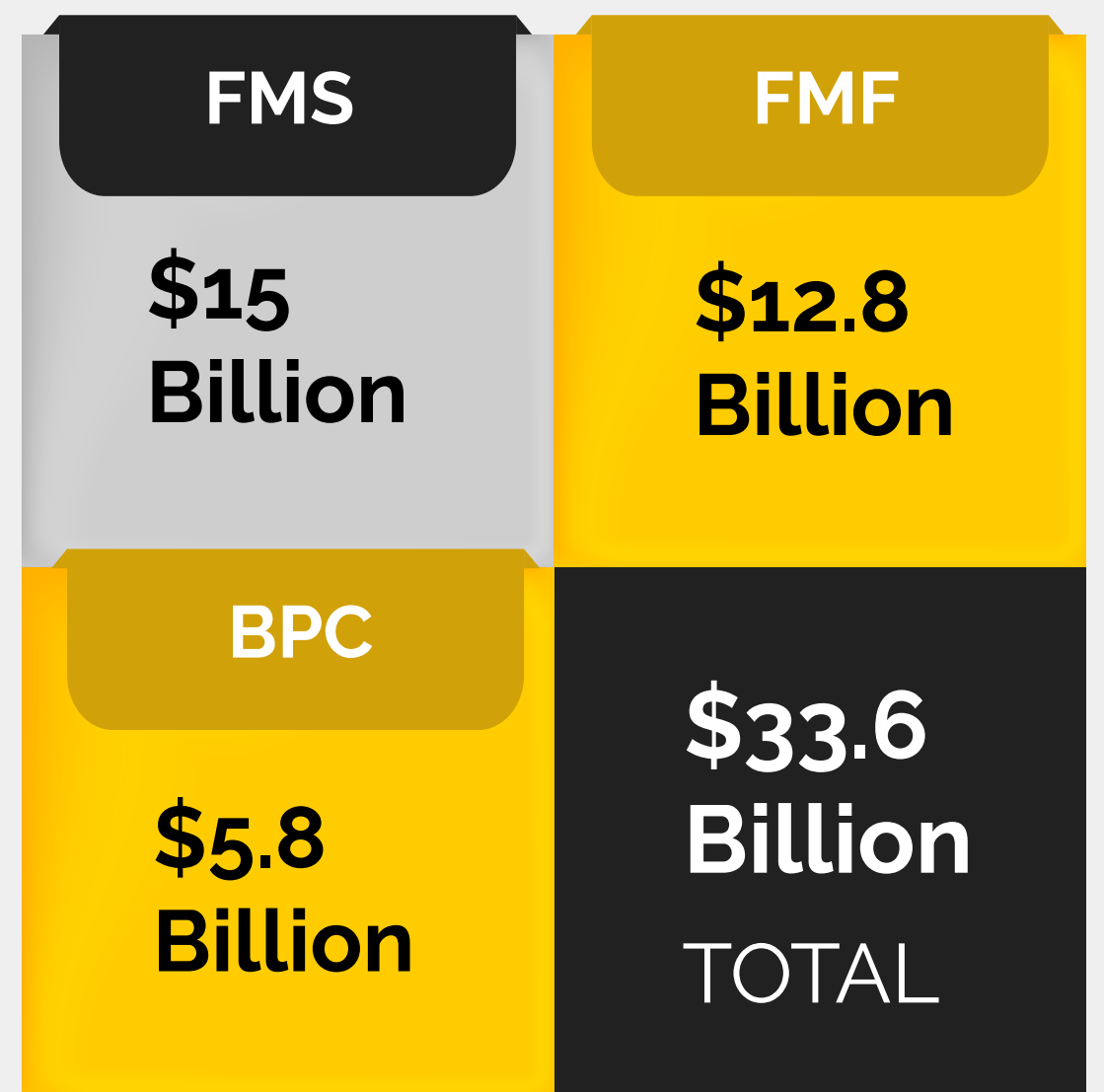
Sharing Global Defense Responsibilities

Army Security Assistance (SA) ensures U.S. forces maintain peace through strength by delivering on mutual security objectives.

SA programs serve as a force multiplier by building modern, and interoperable allies and partners capable of fighting alongside, or in lieu of U.S. forces.

FMS to allies and Partner Nations expands U.S. industrial manufacturing capacity and create jobs. The U.S. Army empowers global International Partners to take on more global defense responsibility and filling in—bolstering U.S. production capacity.
