Mr. Charles Gram serves as the Contracting Director for the Intel, Operations, and Sustainment Support. In this capacity, he is the Directorate's Senior Contracting Officer and advisor on the total acquisition process, including acquisition/contracting strategy, contract pricing, contract management and associated support.

Prior to his current role, he served as the Division Chief for the Global Intelligence Contracting Division, which was comprised of three Branches, which provide support to U.S. Army Intelligence & Security Command and the National Ground Intelligence Center. He also provides direct support to the Director, Combat and Services Contracting on all matters pertaining to Combat and Services Contracting Directorate.



Mr. Gram also served as Chief, Strategic Services Group, ACC-DTA. In this capacity, he led the contracting group responsible for all competitive services in support of both Program Executive Office – Ground Combat Systems (PEO-GCS) and Program Executive Office – Combat Support & Combat Service Support (PEO-CS&CSS), and well as Intelligence Analyst and Linguist support at INSCOM.

Mr. Gram has also served in a Team Chief capacity at ACC-DTA within both the Combat and Tactical Contracting Divisions. In this role, he was responsible for the procurement of hardware and services in support of Program Manager – Tactical Vehicles (PM-TV) and Program Manager – Heavy Brigade Combat Team (PM-HBCT). Prior to these assignments, he worked with numerous commands on Competitive Sourcing (A-76 Cost Comparison) projects.
