<p><b>How can I obtain an official Military Police (MP), Department of the Army Civilian Police (DACP) or Retired MP/DACP Identification that complies with the provisions of the Law Enforcement Officer Safety Act acknowledging my service as a "qualified law enforcement officer"?</b></p>	<p>DODI 5525.12, Law Enforcement Officer Safety Act (LEOSA) Department of Defense implementation was approved 13 FEB 14. The Army Directive and implementation instructions are currently in staffing for Secretary of the Army approval. Concurrently to the staffing of Army guidance, a no-cost to the government, contract is being developed to centrally implement LEOSA Army wide. Once the Army Directive, Implementation instructions and Contract have been finalized the Link to the Application Web site will be posted on the OPMG Web site. The Application web site, operated by a contractor, will contain the application process, who is eligible for credentials, instructions, required documents, electronic application and fees required by the individual. At the present time we anticipate implementation mid 1st Quarter FY15, time line is dependent on approval of Army Directive and award date of contract.</p>
<p><b>What is the process for requesting employment Verification for Army Military Personnel?</b></p>	<p>The U.S. Army Human Resources Command (HRC) is the Employment Verification Source for Army military personnel. Procedures are outlined as follows: The third party requester's should complete a Request Pertaining to Military Records or Standard Form 180 (SF-180). Submit the request to the appropriate Personnel Actions Branch along with any signed releases obtained by the employer. Once complete the requested documentation will be mailed to the requester. <p><b>Does CID hire civilian investigators?</b></p>	<p>CID does hire civilian criminal investigators. The bulk of these civilian investigators reside either in the fraud unit (MPFU), at our largest installations as Sexual Assault Investigators, or Computer Crimes Investigators. CID also has Local National Criminal Investigators in host nation countries such as Germany and Korea, and many CID battalions have BN Assistant OPS Officer (BN AOPS) who are civilian criminal investigators.</p>
<p><b>Why can't I login to the LEAP Portal?</b></p>	<p>Accessing the LEAP Portal requires by name permissions.</p>
<p><b>Why can't I login to the Army Policing Portal?</b></p>	<p><a href="https://west.esps.disa.mil/army/sites/APP">https://west.esps.disa.mil/army/sites/APP</a> 1. Close all web browsers, 2. Copy the above link, 3. Open a new Internet Explorer web browser &amp; paste the link. When prompted select an <b>EMAIL Certificate</b> that is not expired. If those steps do not work repeat the steps 1-3 above and when prompted select another certificate that is not expired.</p>
