BENEFITS OF SERVICE

To enlist into active duty or join the Army Reserve, you have to be between 17 and 35 years of age, and if you qualify, you could receive the following benefits:

- Up to 16 semester hours* a year in tuition assistance while in the active Army or Army Reserve
- Financial assistance to pay back qualifying student loans
- Eligibility for the Montgomery GI Bill or Post 9/11 GI Bill with expanded education benefits
- Medical and dental care
- Eligibility for the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) similar to a 401 (k)
- Priority consideration for future employment with the Partnership for Youth Success (PaYS)
