

LOGISTICS MODERNIZATION PROGRAM (LMP) INCREMENT 2 WAVE 2



NON-ARMY MANAGED ITEMS (NAMI)

OVERVIEW

The NAMI LMP functionality modernizes other Source of Supply (SoS), Army owned managed assets, which enables the Army Materiel Command (AMC) to support all supply mission needs at the tactical and non-tactical level for these assets. Additionally, the NAMI LMP functionality enables the Army to maximize redistribution of existing Army inventory for Class 2, 3P, 4, and 9 items. With implementation of Wave 2, the LMP functionality replaced the last instance of the legacy Commodity Command Standard System (CCSS).

Bottom line, the NAMI LMP functionality improves transaction processing time, eliminates legacy system costs, and facilitates easier access to excess NAMI inventory.



NAMI DETAILS

The NAMI mission is located at the Tank-automotive and Armaments Command (TACOM) in Warren, Michigan and uses the Single Stock Fund financial management and business rules to assure the maximum use of Army-owned, but other SoS-managed, assets. The NAMI LMP functionality was developed by leveraging existing AMI processes, as well as new enhancements specific to the NAMI mission. The NAMI LMP deployment enables AMC to support all supply mission needs at the tactical and non-tactical Army level utilizing a single, integrated, National-level system that maximizes the use of existing Army-owned assets to support Soldiers. The LMP Increment 2 Wave 2 for the NAMI mission replaced the last instance of CCSS in the Army. NAMI LMP provides the modernized capability to continue previously performed processes using the CCSS legacy system, such as: screen Army requisitions to fill from the redistributable excess; fund and pass to the SoS replenishment requisitions not filled from redistribution; budget and execute funding for all NAMI items stocked at Standard Army Retail Supply System (SARRSS) / Global Combat Support System - Army (GCSS-Army) sites located worldwide; receive and grant credit; and support NAMI reporting requirements.
