Major General Paul A. Ostrowski graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1985. He earned a MS degree in National Resource Strategy, as part of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces from the National Defense University in June 2006. He graduated from Joint and Combined Warfighting School at the Joint Forces Staff College in 2000. MG Ostrowski was assigned as the Program Executive Officer, Program Executive Office (PEO) Soldier at Fort Belvoir, Virginia from April 2012-September 2014. He served as the Assistant Deputy for Acquisition and Systems Management, Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Acquisition, Logistics and Technology) in Washington, DC from September 2011-April 2012. He was the Executive Officer to the Commander, United States Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida from May 2010-September 2011. He served as the Director, Operational Test and Evaluation, as well as Program Executive Officer for Special Programs, at United States Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida from June 2006-May 2010. MG Ostrowski was the Program Manager for Counterproliferation at United States Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida from July 2003-July 2005. He served as Legislative Fellow, as well as Project Leader, for the Rapid Equipping Force in both Washington, DC and during Operation Iragi Freedom in Irag from June 2001-July 2003. He was the Systems Acquisition Manager for United States Special Operations Command, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida from July 1998-May 2001. He served as Chief, Fort Bragg Field Operations in the Special Products Office at Fort Bragg, North Carolina from July 1996-June 1998. He also served as a Company Grade Officer in several command and staff positions in Joint Special Operations, Special Forces and Infantry assignments.
