USAG Yongsan completed a Full Scale Exercise this past week, successfully testing our garrison's readiness in the event of an incident and mobilizing our community's emergency services to support contingencies. The successful exercise validates our garrison's ability to respond to and manage a crisis.

The community watch desk in Bldg. 4305 will close as of June 1. Please ensure your unit is aware of this change and knows whom to contact for assistance.

The latest Garrison Enforcer highlights some of the issues we have encountered in the community (page 5). Cybersecurity is another important area where your cooperation is critical to protecting our information infrastructure. There have been a spate of ransomware attacks worldwide so please follow the enclosed guidance to ensure you do not become a victim (page 6). Cyber criminals are targeting military members in online scams and extorting money, especially through social networking activities (page 7). Learn the warning signs and avoid becoming a casualty of cyber fraud.

There is an updated travel advisory for certain areas of the Philippines (pages 8-10). It is always a good idea to check for any travel restrictions before planning your next trip.

Yellow dust is common this time of the year. The levels over the last few weeks have been particularly high. Enclosed is a chart defining the various levels of air pollution in Korea (page 11). It is highly recommended that you stay indoors or wear a mask on those days with high concentration of dust particles.

Soon we will head into monsoon season, or jangma, and there are several areas in USAG Yongsan particularly prone to flooding. Please see the enclosed flood conditions glossary and be aware of the different warning levels, as well as what actions to take in the event of a flood (page 12).

The upcoming noncombatants evacuation operation (NEO) exercise is critical to our readiness and is a high priority for the command. Please have your NEO packets and evacuation kits ready for inspection during Focus Passage June 5-9 at the Seoul American High School (Falcon) gym (page 13), NOT Collier Community Fitness Center.

In May we celebrate Memorial Day. Join us in remembering those who sacrificed so much for this country by participating in any of the events taking place over the long weekend. The 27th Annual Pacwide Men's and Women's Softball Tournament kicks off May 25-29 at Lombardo Field (page 14). 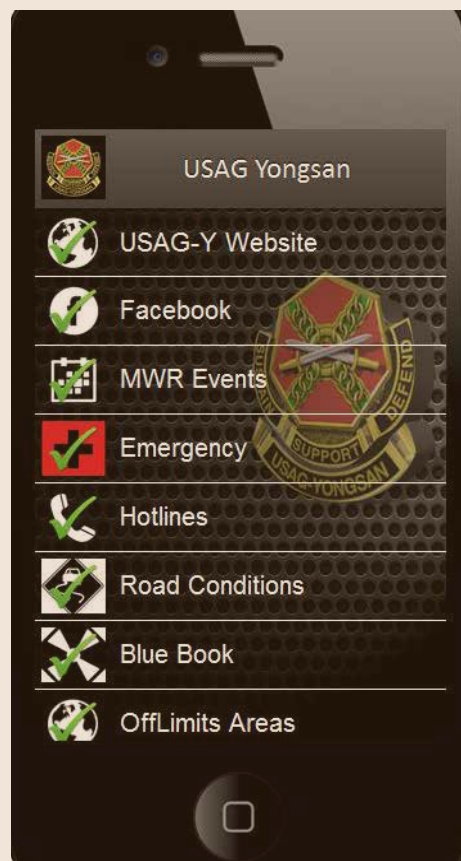

TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS



Beware of 'WannaCry' Ransomware

This ransomware is affecting multiple global entities. To increase our collective defenses across the Department and Federal networks, we urge all employees to take three actions:

- 
- (1) Do not click on links or download files in emails unless you know for sure they are intended for you;**
 - (2) Ensure your personal devices are updated and patched; and,**
 - (3) Backup your data so you can recover your systems if they become infected. Microsoft released a patch in March that addresses this issue.**

Ransomware is a type of malicious software that infects a computer and restricts users' access until a ransom is paid to unlock it. The malware spreads by "phishing," luring unsuspecting users to click on infected email attachments and links in emails to launch the attack. Unpatched or out-of-date systems are particularly vulnerable to ransomware.

Cyber Criminals Target Soldiers

Soldiers are being targeted by organized rings of criminals intent on extorting money from them.

U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command (CID) receives reports each month from Soldiers who have fallen victim to online scams. Most often through social networking activities.

Social media plays a very important role in our modern lives. It helps us learn, share experiences with others and stay connected to people we care about. But social media has a dark side. A dark side where criminals operate – criminals that target Soldiers!

Soldiers, wherever they are, must protect themselves, and their good names and reputations. That includes when they are online. Soldiers who engage in dangerous online behavior place themselves at higher risk of online extortion.

Sextortion, a common online extortion scam where criminals lure Service members into engaging in online sexual activity and then demand money or favors in exchange for not publicizing embarrassing images, videos or information.

Victims of romance and sextortion scams report becoming involved in online relationships that lead to the exchange of personal, sometimes intimate, information and then receiving threats and demands.

The threat is that the Soldier's online relationship will be exposed to their chain of command or to law enforcement authorities. The demand is for money.

Even after meeting the criminal's demands, some Soldiers find themselves in a vicious, never-ending cycle of increasing demands. Some Soldiers have lost thousands of dollars to these scams. Some victims have committed suicide.

To fight against these scams, Soldiers should arm themselves with information. Learn the warning signs of fraudulent relationships and the steps to reporting a crime.

The Army has some excellent online resources that are available to everyone.

(U//FOUO) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY, CDRUSPACOM MODIFIES THE TRAVEL RESTRICTION FOR THE PHILIPPINES AS FOLLOWS: ADDS TRAVEL RESTRICTION FOR THE PALAWAN REGION; REMOVES TRAVEL RESTRICTION FOR THE CENTRAL VISAYAS REGION; MAINTAINS TRAVEL RESTRICTION FOR MINDANAO, AND THE SULU ARCHIPELAGO. 3.A. (U//FOUO) THE BASELINE FPCON IS FPCON BRAVO WITH ADDITIONAL CHARLIE MEASURE 5 AND SHIPBOARD CHARLIE MEASURE 5. ITM 1 AND 7 APPLIES TO THE ENTIRE COUNTRY AND ITM 11 APPLIES FOR THE TRAVEL

Appendix 1 – FLOOD CONDITIONS (FLOODCON) Alert Status

FLOODCON I: An initial readiness condition declared at the beginning of the summer season.

FLOODCON I Measures:

- Identify and preposition resources, plan recovery efforts and integrate into response plans
- Conduct risk assessments of training areas and installation areas to identify hazards
- Update and validate alert rosters
- Identify and order high use items supplies for the summer season

FLOODCON II: A warning and alert condition declared by mutual decision between the SRO and the USAG-Yongsan Commander when heavy rain is probable. The weather conditions must meet one or more of the following conditions:

- Weather forecasts indicate the potential for intense and/or prolonged rainfall
- Actual rainfall of 3 inches or more within a 12-hour
- Water level on the Han River gauge rises 2 meters (6 feet) or more within a 6-hour period

FLOODCON II Measures:

- Initiate response to protect life, equipment, and property
- Units account for personnel and equipment
- USAG-Yongsan alerts Tenant Units to activate Quick Response Teams
- Conduct risk assessment to determine control measures for off-post movement of personnel
- Notify USAG-Yongsan community members of FLOODCON alert status on all available media outlets

FLOODCON III: An alert condition declared by a mutual decision between the SRO and the USAG-Yongsan Commander when a summer storm is imminent. It is declared if any of the following occur:

- Rainfall exceeds 2 inches or more in a 1-hour period
- Rainfall exceeds 4 inches in a 6-hour period
- Rainfall exceeds 6 inches or more in a 12-hour period
- Flooding from a previous rainfall has backed up drainage systems resulting in actual or potential massive flooding
- Water level on the Han River gauge rises 2 feet or more within a 1-hour period

FLOODCON III Measures:

- USAG-Yongsan assumes 24/7 IOC operations on order from Garrison Commander
- USAG-Yongsan alerts Tenant Units to activate Quick Response Teams
- Tenant units restrict movement of non-essential travel and gain accountability of all personnel
- USAG-Yongsan continues to notify community personnel of weather status by use of all media outlets
- Ensure tenant units clear their areas of responsibilities of hazards
