Logistics Modernization Program (LMP)



Mr. Marty Trackman currently serves as the Deputy Product Manager for the U.S. Army's Logistics Modernization Program (LMP). In this role, he supports the Product Manager, exercising centralized authority and control over one of the largest Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) implementations in the U.S. Army and across the Army Materiel Command's (AMC) National-level logistics environment.

He previously served as the LMP Business Management Division Chief where he oversaw the LMP Product Management Office's (PMO) contracts, operations management, business capabilities acquisition, and resource management. Specifically, he was responsible operating budgets to ensure effectiveness in achieving all program objectives, as well as the development, award, and oversight of all LMP PMO contracts/task orders and their compliance with all Federal Regulations.

He joined the LMP PMO in 2006 as a Government Support Contractor, organizing, directing, and managing business area functional activities for Corporate Information Management (CIM). In this position, he played a critical role in the LMP second deployment in 2009. He then joined the Government in 2010 serving as the Chief, Logistics Management Division for the LMP, responsible for managing information assurance, technical infrastructure, legacy sustainment, customer support, deployment stabilization, and business transformation. In this role, he helped successfully manage the LMP third and final deployment in 2010. From December 2011 through December 2017, he served as the LMP Assistant Product Manager for Sustainment, where he oversaw the management of the deployed/operational production baseline, as well as compliance and auditability statutory and regulatory requirements. Additionally, he led the effort to transition services from the prime contractor to the Government for all sustainment and development activities. Prior to working with the LMP, he held positions with various commercial companies as an accounting professional.

Mr. Trackman is a member of the Army Acquisition Corps, is Level III Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act (DAWIA) certified in Program Management, and holds a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Northeastern University in Boston, Massachusetts.
