Provost Marshal General of the U.S. Army serving as the principal military advisor to the Secretary of the Army and the Chief of Staff of the Army on policing matters, including law enforcement, criminal investigations, criminal intelligence fusion, corrections, biometrics, physical security, high risk personnel security, antiterrorism, and detention operations. Develops and executes strategy, policies, plans, and programs for the Army's policing function. Coordinates with the U.S. Department of Defense and other federal, state, local, and international law enforcement agencies.

Commanding General, USACIDC, serving as the Department of the Army's independent criminal investigative authority, free of actual or perceived undue command influence, reporting directly to the Secretary of the Army and the Chief of Staff of the Army. Oversees five brigade-level commands/directorates providing global support in the conduct of significant criminal investigations, protective service operations, forensics, and investigative support to military commissions. Maintains executive liaison with federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. Responsible for training, personnel readiness, maintenance, and logistical support for no-notice deployment for Army, Joint, and combined contingency operations worldwide.

MG Kevin Vereen was born at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and is a native of Fayetteville. He graduated from Campbell University in North Carolina in 1988.
