




Honorable Order of Saint Christopher

Great job Lifeliners for acting quickly and accomplishing the mission this morning!




372nd ICTC




Expert Field Medical Badge competition






PMV-2 PLR ANALYSIS

The overwhelming majority of the PMV-2 fatalities in FY19 were the result of single-vehicle accidents. That means the other guy, that distracted "cage" driver, was not at fault. These mishaps often have a script that goes something like this: A rider was traveling at a high rate of speed on his sport bike, rode into a curve too fast, lost control, departed the road and struck a solid, unmovable object. Don't be this guy.

MISHAP BRIEFS

FOV

A 19-year-old Private First Class assigned to Fort Carson, Colorado, died in a privately owned weapons (POW) mishap in Colorado Springs, Colorado, at 0800 local. The Soldier was reportedly attempting to disassemble a handgun when a discharged round struck him in the chest. He was pronounced dead at the scene by the county coroner.

Since FY16, the Army has lost an average of three Soldiers a year to POW mishaps. Leaders must continue to emphasize the importance of off-duty weapons safety.
